From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building

is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

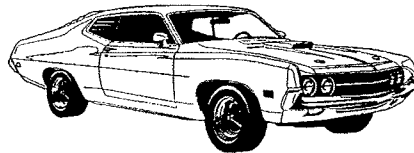

1970 Torino Cobra

[Revell #2353; 1/25th scale; modified reissue; 123 pieces, plus decals]

Last year, when we got the '70 *Torino GT* from Revell in their ProModeler series, a lot of us who bought and built the model wanted a Cobra companion to this kit. Revell did not disappoint us when they made the announcement of the '70 Cobra as one of this year's offerings. available in their regular lineup at a **version only**, devoid of extra parts pieces, as was the case with the '70 me!



Revell decided to make the Cobra normal price by making it a **box stock** for a drag version, or photoetch trim Torino GT version, which is fine with

When I saw the **box** at the hobby shop, I noticed it was **huge** – the same size as the ProModeler kit box, with one notable exception – it was a **good two-piece box**. **Thanks, Revell!** Upon opening the box, everything was bagged except the glass and tires, and, of course, the **glass was scuffed**. Revell, please bag or wrap the glass. This small step will make untold numbers of us happy campers. Anyway, let's look at the kit.

The 21-piece **engine assembly** depicts a well-detailed replica stock **429 Cobra Jet V-8**, with a **4-speed transmission**. This is exactly the same engine as in the aforementioned GT, except that there are **no speed parts** for a drag version. In my opinion, this is one of the better renderings of the Ford V-8 in any model kit. If you are going to superdetail this engine, one of the things you should do is to strip the valve covers, and refinish them in a flat aluminum metalizer paint. Add the appropriate wiring and plumbing, and you will wind up with a first class engine.

The 15-piece **chassis** is a very simple affair, starting with the floorboard and subframe in one piece. The 9" Ford rear and leaf springs are separate pieces, as are the rear shocks. The exhaust system is one piece with the 'H' pipe connecting either side. The front suspension provides posable steering, with the spindles connected by the steering linkage. The front stabilizer bar finishes up this well-detailed assembly, which by the way, is the same as what you get in the GT.

I've said it before, and I'll say it again – The **wheel and tire selection** is the shortcoming of this kit. What we have here is a **14 x 6 styled steel wheel** with an **F70-15 Goodyear Speedway Wide Tread** tire. This combo is too small for the Cobra, as the real car was equipped with **15 x 7 wheels** and **F60-15 Goodyear Polyglas GTs**, or **Firestone Wide Ovals**, in most cases. Oh well, parts box to the rescue!

The 14-piece **interior assembly** has **correct Cobra door panels**, and this was a pleasant surprise to me. Most of the time, the manufacturers will try to palm off a different version on us, but Revell took the high road in this case, and gave us the proper door panels. The bucket seats have always been somewhat curious to me, in that every photo of a Torino or Cobra that I have seen displayed the high back bucket seats with integral headrests. This kit has the same low back bucket seats with separate headrests, which is probably correct for an early production car. The rest of the interior is a first class affair, with the aforementioned separate, easy to install door panels, separate console, two-piece seats, hanging pedals, steering column, and a **rim blow steering wheel**.

The **body** itself is correct, and catches the aggressive look of the '70 Torino Cobra, except that the **GT-specific louvers** on the **rear quarter panel** are **still present**. To their credit, **Revell instructs the builder to remove them**, which is easy enough to do. The taillights, front grille, and rear panel (*which are specific to the Cobra*) are also included in the kit, and are correct. A few differences between the two kits would include the **shaker hood scoop** and **air cleaner assembly**, which are downright gorgeous, and the **hood** (*complete with hood pins*) with the proper cutout for the scoop. Again, Revell took the high road and gave us these parts, when they could have simply left well enough alone. Thanks again, Revell! Yet another bonus is a set of **rear window louvers**. Correct, and very welcome! The necessary decals are included with the car, and Revell has seen fit to **give us the measurements as to how to mask off the hood for the flat black panel**.

All in all, I feel that this is one of Revell's best efforts yet. Sure, it has a few economic shortcomings, but I will take them any day of the week to get a model as good as this! Am I happy with this? **You betcha!** If you are a musclecar fanatic,

a Ford fan, a Torino Cobra lover, or any or all of these combinations, run, do not walk, to buy this kit. *Now Revell, how about a Ranchero GT?*

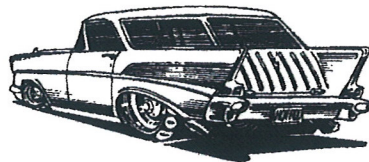
