
## *'Dubs' (?!?)*

Note: ERTL also has this one out in 1/18th scale!); a 'Route 66' '62 Corvette convertible (incl. Todd and Buzz figures); "Jurassic Park Bigfoot T-wrecks" Ford monster truck, and "Universal Monsters" Dodge monster truck; a 'Rat Rods' series in 1/64th scale, that will include a '29 Ford Model A roadster, '25 Model T roadster, and a '29 Model A tub; and finally, a 'Lowrider Mini-diorama' set in 1/64th scale....*Porsche* will debut the Cayenne SUV for soccer moms early in 2003, in two versions, both equipped with 4.5-liter V-8s. Lincoln sold only 379 copies (out of about 1,000 units produced since last Summer) of the truck from November through February. The truck was delayed five months, missing the chance to beat the Cadillac EXT to market. The EXT, by comparison, sold 2,236 units through February -

This was the first time in NASCAR's 54-year history that a driver was forced to sit out a race under these circumstances. Apparently, Harvick vowed to spin out Coy Gibbs over the radio, before ramming his truck from behind entering the back straightaway. Doh!....Robert Urich, star of 'Vegas' (along with a '57 T-Bird), and 'Spenser for Hire' (along with a late-model Mustang GT), died of cancer last month at the age of 55....For those of you unaware that Gordon for divorce, I just heard that his lawyer is countersuing her. Jeff and his lawyer contend that since Jeff puts his life on the line to earn his money, he should get more than 50 percent of it. Other examples of this 'Cladding-free' environment he is intent on creating are the Pontiac G-Force concept car, which is rumored to be the next Grand Prix, due out in 2004, and a new Bon*neville*, known as the *G/XP*, which is basically a Bonneville sans cladding, with a flush-mounted spoiler, painted in a Dark Argentinian Blue metallic, with smoked head and tail light lenses (a special edition that will be sold in 2003). This one, like the Solstice concept car, went from concept to show car in four months. GM will apparently drop cladding on all 2004 Bonnevilles as well as the 2004 Grand Am SE. As far as 'decontenting' vehicles, it is Bob's goal to revert some things such as anti-lock brakes, to option status. His belief is that costly features should only become standard equipment if a large number of consumers order them as options. I'm glad to see that Lutz has been able to light a fire under the gang at GM!... Don't know about you guys, but I just ran across some neat display cases at Hobby Works. They are made by *Hobbico* (hobbico.com). and actually have diorama accessories available! They are available in 1/18th, 1/24th-25th, 1/43rd, and 1/64th scales. You can get scenery background and asphalt and checkered flag base inserts, along with road signs, a gas pump, and a choice of flush or base-mounted lighting (w/battery packs, IIRC!). So, for that special model, check 'em out at Hobby Works, or online - thanks, Kevin! ....Ferrari is seeing red! Seems as

though gray-market importers

won a battle over bringing non-U.S.-spec Ferraris into the coun*try*. A nearly year-long battle – at least related to 2001 model 360s and 550 Maranellos - was resolved, in some cases with onsite inspections of certified U.S. Ferraris and gray-market imports. For example, Ferrari says that non-U. S. 550 Maranellos lacked door beams required under federal crash standards, meaning importers would be required to remove the door skins to weld the steel bar in place. The DOT determined that the door beams were installed during the manufacture of both U.S. and non-U.S. models. The 550 Barchetta, for example, has the door beams installed for structural strength for the roofless model. I guess that local importers, such as Baltimore-based JK Technologies LLC, can now get back to work on customer cars, meaning that former BET chairman Robert Johnson (whose plight I detailed in the January, 2002 newsletter -"Prancing Horsies and Big Kitties!") will now get his Ferrari!.... Danbury Mint is throwing a retirement party, and you're all invited! The party is for their Iris Mist '65 GTO convertible. As of June 30, 2002, you will no longer be able to order one of these. So, if you are interested, this is your last chance. You can reach 'em at 47 Richards Avenue, Norwalk, CT 06857, or toll-free at 1-888-854-7108, Monday through Friday, 9 a. m. to 5 p.m., Eastern Time. Sorry to see ya go, baby!....In the meantime, the gang at the 'other' Mint (Franklin) is offering a threedimensional representation of modern man's 'cave' - his garage!

Their latest masterpiece, entitled simply "The Garage", attempts to define the mystique of this modern-day 'cave.' It includes things commonly associated with men's hangouts – a scale workbench (with a recently delivered pizza on it), complete with repair manuals, a toolbox filled with an assortment of tools, spare tires and quarts of oil, a trash can, overflowing with empty soda cans empty pizza boxes, and other assorted items; and, finally, man's best friend, a dog, ready to snatch some donuts off of the bench! The topper is the red and white '58 Corvette convertible, with the standards we have come to expect - opening doors, hood, and trunk, and in this case, a car cover! #### NASCAR Ace Buck Baker dies at 83

Hot off the wire! *Buck Baker*, a two-time Winston Cup champion who was included on NASCAR's 50 greatest drivers list, has died. He was 83.

Baker died late Sunday night (April 14th) at Carolinas Medical Center. Family members said he was in the hospital for a procedure involving a pacemaker that had been implanted earlier.


Baker was part of NAS-CAR's history, learning his driving skills while running moonshine along the back-

roads of North Carolina. He was a city bus driver in Charlotte when he turned to racing full-time, competing in NASCAR's inaugural season.

He went on to win 46 Winston Cup races – 13th on the all-time list – and 44 poles. He was the first back-to-back series champion, winning titles in 1956 and 1957

Buck Baker, born Elzie Wylie

Baker on March 4, 1919, in Richburg, S.C., started 631 races, seventh-most in NASCAR, and ran the most laps and miles for three consecutive years beginning in 1955. He was a three-time winner of the Southern 500 at Darlington Raceway, one of NASCAR's most



storied races.

"There was a time in the modified division that nobody could beat him," Buddy Baker said. "He won 27 in a row once at old Charlotte fairgrounds track, and the bad part was that we were the promoters at that track. They'd boo him coming in and boo him going out, but the next day everybody would be hanging around at his shop."

He is reported to be setting up distributors across the U.S., planning to import the first cars in 12 months, and is confident his new company, to be called *Zastava Motor Works USA*, could sell 60,000 cars in its first year.

Engines will come from a major European automaker (I.e., Volkswagen, Fiat, Buck Baker, who retired in 1976, was inducted into the *National Motorsports Press Association's Hall of Fame* in 1982 and the *International Motorsports Hall of Fame* in 1990.

For the past 20 years, Baker had operated the *Buck Baker Racing School*, one of the first schools to teach the skills involved in stock

car racing. The school was based at North Carolina Speedway in Rockingham and also operated at tracks in Atlanta and Bristol, Tenn.

Four-time Winston Cup champion *Jeff Gordon* drove a stock car for the first time at Baker's driving school in

Rockingham, the first step in his move from open-wheel racing in Indiana to the NASCAR stardom he now enjoys.

Baker is survived by his wife of 30 years, Susan Painter Baker; two sons, Buddy of Sherrills Ford and Randy of Kannapolis; a daughter, Susie Baker of Charlotte, a sister, two grandsons and two great granddaughters. We'll miss ya!





#### Hot Rod Lincoln!

The well-known tuning firm of *McLaren* is back in the tuning business! They intend to turn out a *Hot Rod Lincoln LS* this year in limited quantities (500 or less) at somewhat elevated prices (\$56,000!). They will not be real hot rods in the sense of the word, but more like BMW and its M series of vehicles. They even made reference to *Commander Cody and the Lost Planet Airmen*, and their 'Hot Rod Lincoln' song!

To the stock 252 hp. 3.9 liter V-8, McLaren adds an *Eaton super-charger*, and a *McLaren-built cat-back dual exhaust system*, in an attempt to boost the horsepower to

around 350 (!). Power runs through a six-speed manual transmission to taller rear gears for better performance. McLaren estimates these mods will shave more than two seconds (!) off its zero-to-sixty and quarter mile times!

The suspension will not be left alone, either. It gets 18" OZ wheels with a replaceable rim, bigger brakes, performance-tuned shocks and springs, and rides 1" lower than stock.

McLaren sees all the Lincoln SUVs as prime targets for upgrades. Lincoln is not a partner in the project, but Ford is supportive (and likes the good publicity!). Sport compacts are next on their list of things to do!

## 'To the Batcave!' Directions

Just in case you guys have not heard as yet, Polar Lights is set to release several 'Bat vehicles' this Fall. They will include the 1960's Batmobile glue kit (reported to be an all new original tool), a Bat Plane glue kit (Aurora re-release), a 1960's Batmobile 1/24th diecast, and a 1950's Batmobile 1/24th diecast (both all new original kits). Thanks to Tom Carter of Hobby Heaven for the scoop!

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
