# Super Caddy!

Specialty-vehicle execs John Heinricy, Mark Reuss, and Corvette Chief Engineer Dave Hill, recently visited several small automakers in the United Kingdom. Their goal? To find one capable of producing up

to 300 Cadillac Ciens a year! This trip shows

GM's willingness to consider a *limited* production run of this 7.5-liter V-12,

which produces 750 hp and 450 lb-ft of torque, coupled to a six-speed semi-automatic gearbox.

Do ya think this could have anything to do with

Ford's decision to produce a limited run of the GT40?!
Nah!

A decision is

expected by Summer's end. The car led the pre-race parade for the 24 Hours of Lemans!

### Next Gen Vette

GM says the *next-gen* (C6) Corvette, originally scheduled for late Fall of '03, is on track for a Spring '04 debut.

It's claimed that GM will make the car shorter and narrower to boost European sales. Pop-up headlights may be MIA in favor of new Xenon fixed units. Rumor has it that the exterior of the new car was designed by Tom Peters (of Aztek fame!!)!


It reportedly packs small block power in the form of the Gen IV *V-8.* which is based on the current **LS1** and **LS6** V-8s. Standard mill output is rumored to be 400 hp, with 400 lb-ft of torque, while the **Z06 LS6 motor** (due out as an '06 model) is rated at 425 hp, and 415 *lb-ft torque*. GM is hard at work on a variable-displacement, power-on-demand management system called, appropriately enough, Displacement on Demand! It can shut down two or four cylinders when not needed for better fuel economy on the highway. This system is expected to debut on GM's '04 pickups, with car applications to follow.

The new car will share chassis, brakes, and suspension bits with the Caddy XLR, although the platforms will be different lengths. Upgraded brakes, with slotted disks and a longer lasting pad material will be fitted, along with the latest version of GM's active handling system (Magnetic Ride Control). Goodyear run-flat tires may be replaced with Z06 Goodyear Eagle F1 rubber. Time will tell!

# **Euro Supercars**

More bang for yer buck! Purchasers of the new Ferrari FX (to debut Sept. 26th at the Paris Mo-

than the originally announced \$450,000 sticker! Cut out the op-

tions, I say! For that, you get a V12 with horsepower projected around 650 in a car weighing about 2,650 pounds. That

works out to a 0 to 60 time of about 3.2 seconds, and a top end of about 217 mph! Just what you need for those early-morning commutes! Flash! According to Autoweek's website, the car will be named 'Enzo', in honor of the company's founder. Sadly, they

have taken more than a year to come to this conclusion!

Meanwhile. Bentley Motors will add a 'super' GT coupe to their

Bentley of sub-five second 0 to 60 runs, and a top speed over 180

> mph. The car will reportedly also be equipped with allwheel-drive, a stability control system, and a sixspeed automatic with paddle shifter. No word as to how

much this speed is gonna cost (although, nothing

GM is so anxious to give the upcoming Pontiac GTO more (tire-shredding) power, that it is willing to subject the car to the dreaded gas-guzzler tax! "For a car to be credible, accepted as a rebirth of the rear-drive American muscle car, it has got to have that rocket-sled acceleration off the line," says GM's Bob Lutz. While GM has not released the GTO's horsepower, when asked if the target is 350 hp., Bob Lutz responded, "You are in the right neighborhood." Awright, Bob!!.... And speakin' of returns, didja hear that actor-turned-congressman Ben 'Cooter' Jones is attempting to jump-start his political career? 'Cooter', er Ben (from "Dukes of Hazzard" fame) currently owns Cooter's Place, a restaurant, bluegrass hangout, and "Dukes of Hazzard" memorabilia emporium located in Virginia's Blue Ridge mountains. *Mercedes* will plug their 2003 E-Class in the Summer sequel Men in Black II, which opens July 3rd. A commercial for the car

will debut on July 24th....Nissan sary Kickoff at the Corvette plant in has pre-sold 6,200 of the new 350Z since January, and the car won't be in showrooms until mid-August! It will feature a 280+ horsepower, 3.5-liter, front-mounted V-6, with either a six-speed manual or a fivespeed automatic transmission, and will sell for between \$26,269 and **\$34,079....**For all you 'Macho Men' (nothing personal against 'The Village People'!), GM is reportedly pushing back plans to offer a Hummer pickup from calendar year 2003 to 2004. The first model, the H2 SVT, goes on sale in late June with a base price of \$48,800, while the H2 SUT (Sport Utility Truck?!) (featuring a small pickup bed and a cargo door at the rear of the passenger cabin, GM's midgate), was supposed to come out within 12 months of each other. 

# Chevy Thunder!

The gang over at Chevy are set to expand their performance lineup – the *SS nameplate* will multiply! GM will revive the *SS* nameplate next year, both on the *Impala* line, and a new idea (*I assume*, based on favorable show appearances) of a *Silverado SS*. Don't get yer panties in a bunch as far as the Impala SS is concerned, though. The 'performance' market they will attempt to enter with the

car (presumably against the new Mercury Marauder), they will be at a distinct disadvantage - two cylinders shy! Yup, they are stuffing the 3800 Supercharged V-6 between the fenderwells, ala the Pontiac Grand Prix. Not that this is a bad package, it will simply be no competition for the kick-ass Marauder. Better luck next time, GM! On the other hand, the Silverado SS will be an extended cab short bed truck stuffed full of 6.0liters (345 hp) of V-8 power, full time all wheel drive, locking rear end, and 20" wheels and tires (a. k.a. Dubs!). It will also feature a single, specially tuned 3.5" outlet pipe that will give the truck a "Throaty NASCAR-inspired roar," according to GM. It'll be available in red, blue, and black, w/pewter-colored leather interior. Sounds much neater than the Monte Carlo SS, albeit more expensive!!

#### '58 T-Bird

[Revell/Monogram kit #85-2385; 137 parts total; white, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires]

Known as the 'Square Birds', the 1958 to 1960 T-birds were low slung like a factory built lead sled. The first generation had been wildly popular and still are to this day - note the 2003 T-birds. But Ford, under leadership of Robert McNamara, decided that sales of 3 to 1 better than Chevy's Corvette were still not good enough, and created the four-seater T-birds. I would have thought these to be less popular than the first generation car, given the popularity of the two- seater, but in fact were even more popular than the 1955 to 1957 cars.

This kit, originally issued in 1964, has been reissued more times than I can remember, but according to my sources, this is the sixth time we have been offered this great kit which has stood the test of time very well. Never since the first issue have we gotten the radical custom parts including the bubble top (in clear plastic). In its original issue, it was done in four colors of plastic for the body including black, yellow, and possibly red and green. The molds were polished to such a degree that painting the body wasn't necessary. I believe the black kits were the most common while the yellow ones are rare. This kit really is a milestone kit in that it builds up off the chassis like the better kits

of today. Originally the windows and bubble top were tinted slightly green. Other firsts for this kit were the separate chromed windshield frame, sun visors, hardtop, opening doors and separate whitewall inserts. The hood has a working cast in hinge that works well; just think of the hood hinges, or lack thereof, the competition had in 1964.

As a huge fan of T-birds, the 1958 to 1960 cars have always been my least favorite, yet this is the third time I've bought this kit. I've built the other two, and can say they go together very well and easily, even compared to kits of today. The interior builds up off of the chassis, and then slots into the body. No screws or glue are needed to keep the car together, and no, the chassis doesn't fall out when you lift the model by the body. There are no metal axles for the wheels; they mount to accurate suspensions with small plastic retainers inside the wheel assemblies. With a little care, they will rotate. In most circa 1964 model kits, the inner fender panels are generic and inaccurate, but in this kit they were done correctly as were the un-chromed stock valve covers, and the antennae which are actually scaled right, instead of a tree trunk with a huge ball on top that was the norm back then.

Missing from this issue are the mild custom grille that inserted into the stock bumper/grille, and the custom straight exhaust system that went down the chassis under the rear axle while splitting into four pipes. The dropped front a-arms/spindles are included for the

first time in years, but there is no mention in the instructions of cutting two coils off the rear coil springs to lower the rear of the car. The only other missing parts seem to be the chrome band that went over the bubble top and the Ansen mags.

The decal sheet is all new with white scallops (with blue outlines) that might look better on the mild custom T-bird like the custom cars of the early 60's. The bubble top custom begs for a 'flake and candy paint job. There are also light blue pin striping scrollwork decals and white decal inserts for a two-tone upholstery. But by far the most sought after parts in this kit will be the tri-bar spinner wheel covers.

Despite appearances, this is a very buildable kit even for a builder with less experience. No reference pictures are needed to build a very accurate looking model, but would serve to further enhance an already great kit. Thanks should go to *Norm Veber* for his needed assistance.

# H & McC Coyote

[RC/ERTL kit # 31559; 160 parts total; gray, chrome, clear, vinyl tires]

This kit has always been a disappointment to me because I have always been a big fan of the Ford GT-40/MK-IV/J car upon which this car is based. MPC converted the mold to do this Coyote, and it just isn't done right. The car in the Hardcastle and McCormick TV show was based in part on a real kit car that was available at the time. I remember reading that there were, of course, several cars on the set for the various shots and stunts. The "glamour"car had a Porsche engine in it, but since it didn't have the sound the show producer wanted, the sound effects department dubbed in the sound of a Ferrari engine.

The dimensions of the upper body look correct, but it doesn't fit on this chassis properly, insofar as the engine is half way into the interior. Look at the box art car and you can see a red engine box between the firewall and the seats. Having built this kit just after it was originally released years ago, I'd recommend leaving out part #54, which is the previously mentioned engine box then move the firewall forward to the seats.

Anything you do with the engine as far as the H&McC car is concerned will be wrong as mentioned above, but it is a nice big block Ford with either single or twin 4- barrel intakes. There is a very nice set of 'Le Mans' valve

covers and an equally nice transaxle and halfshafts to back up the engine as well.

The fact is the whole chassis is the best part of this kit and the only thing worth keeping. It's very accurate and well done and one of the best kits MPC ever did. Strangely, RC made the same mistake with the tires that MPC made years ago. They gave us four small B.F. Goodrich hollow tires that are great for small cars like the Fiero, but look stupid on the rear of this car. You can see this on the box art car. Replacing them with the appropriate larger tires will make a world of difference. I'm beginning to see a pattern with RC/ERTL in that they seem to not know what parts go with the various versions of old kits, so they throw in extra parts in an effort to cover themselves. I suppose this is better than being shortchanged a crucial piece. Case in point - there are three firewalls, One for the H&McC car, one for the MKIV, and one for the J car. There are two dash tops as well. The really queer thing is there are several parts that never were in any of the three mentioned versions of this kit and are not in the instructions. There are the two F.I.A. suitcases (required for endurance racing) that have been redone with straps and buckles, since any of the three versions were last issued, but are not needed for this kit.


