## Sunstar '71 Mustang Mach 1

This new 1/18th scale diecast is the first diecast ever made of a 1971-1973 Mustang. ERTL will be coming out with a 1973 fastback later this year. It comes in red, white and grabber blue.

For a low priced model, Sunstar did their homework and got most of the major details correct. The body looks very accurate and the grabber blue paint is smooth. The window chrome is painted nicely and the deluxe door panels have the correct wood painted inserts. The dual exhaust system is replicated well, as are the chrome tips. The staggered shock setup adds to the realism and the front and real spoilers are a nice touch.

The black interior has front seats that fold down and the steering column has a turn signal lever. The hood has twist locks and even the power steering hoses are present. The door handles are chrome, the magnum 500 wheels look good, and the fixed rear windows are not forgotten.

Now for the flaws and inaccuracies. The rear view mirror should be connected to the windshield and the 351 ram air decals should be more visible from a side view. The ram air duct is etched into the hood and should be a separate piece. The hood hinge is toy-like and could have been done better. The engine is supposed to be a 351 Cleveland, but from the looks of the valve covers, it appears to be the 429 engine. There are no twist lock brackets and the trunk only partially opens. The stripes on the rear quarter panels extend too far, and the antenna is far short of the actual fixed factory style.

The engine color is the same as the car and should be a darker By: Rex Turner

Ford corporate blue. Lastly, the side mirrors have too severe an angle, but to Sunstar's credit, they do have a mirror surface, and are the correct body color.

Overall, this model is very good and can be improved with some detail painting. I suggest painting the following parts black: headlight buckets, cowl and inner fender panels, area behind grille, ram air seal on air cleaner, and ram air ducting system on underside of hood. The hood latch, fog lights, seat inserts, leaf springs, and vacuum motors should be silver. The engine and air cleaner should be dark blue and the battery caps should be painted red. Other details under the hood could be picked out, but this would be a good start to a better looking model. 🛎

## Testors 'Hot Metal' '71 Mustang Mach I by: Rex Turner

This rendition clearly derives its roots from either the MPC or AMT annual kit. The body represents a blend of a '71 and '73 Mustang. Thwe '73 features being the larger front bumper, and decla stripe on the trunk lid. Otherwise, thegrille and decals are of '71 vintage.

The pre-painted body is well done and respendent in a light yellow (a bit too light, if you ask me), with a gloss black (too shiny) hood and trim. The kit includes foil for the side mirrors, and the interior is accurate as well.

The kit builds up easily, with only a few pieces requiring glue, with the remainder attached with screws.

There are no decals for the engine displacement that would appear on the hood scoop. The engine is the '70-only Boss 429, which was not available on the '71 to '73 Mustangs. The air cleaner attempts to replicate the ram air option, and comes pretty close.

Dual resonators substitute for a lack of mufflers that were standard.

The rear spoiler mounts too high,

and the vintage inner fender panels remind me of the shortcomings of plastic kits of that era.

Lastly, the full hubcaps may be correct for another year or base model, but a Mach I should have either hubcaps and trim rings, or Magnum 500 wheels. If you can accept these inaccuracies, the kit can be assembled in a few hours.



will produce 700 replicas of a coral red Thunderbird that is driven by Halle Berry's character, "Jinx," in the upcoming James Bond film. The movie,

dubbed "Die Another Day" is due out in November, with the Bond Bird following in the Spring. Ford hopes the commemorative Thunderbird follows the success of a Neiman Marcus edition T-Bird the company offered for the Christmas season of 2000 with a limited production of 200 units. The Neiman Marcus cars sold out in 2 hours and 15 minutes for an asking price of \$42,000. No price has been released for the upcoming commemorative car. The car will feature 21-spoke chrome wheels, solid white seats and whitetrimmed lower door panels and speaker covers. The steering wheel and shift knob will be trimmed in "Black Ink" leather and a "007" badge will be placed on the instrument panel, while signature Thunderbird insignias are imbedded on the seat backs. Each vehicle will also feature a numbered, commemorative plaque mounted on the inside of the glove box....Toyota Racing Development (TRD) U.S.A. has announced that it will submit a 4.3-liter V8 engine to the Grand American

Road Racing Association (Grand-Am) for approval to compete in the Daytona Prototype Class of the Rolex Sports Car Series beginning in '03. The Toyota Daytona Prototype V8 engine will be based on the 4.3-liter, four-cam, 32-valve powerplant that is currently used in

production models sold in North America. The engine will be submitted for inclusion in the "A" Type Daytona Prototype engine category, which is based on production

six- and eight-cylinder engines, which have a maximum displacement of 4.3 liters. "We believe that Grand-Am has created a unique vision for an American-based sports prototype series," said Jim Aust, president and CEO of TRD U.S.A. "TRD is always interested in potential business opportunities that expand its presence in U.S. motorsports. Our goal will be to offer Daytona Prototype teams a competitive engine at a competitive price." TRD will provide final engine specifications and pricing upon receiving certification from the Grand-Am series in September. TRD will sell the spec engine parts and components to independent engine builders, and it will have the capability to sell and support complete race-ready engines directly to Daytona Prototype teams. TRD currently produces V8 powerplants in its off-road and sport compact/ import drag racing programs. Participation in the Grand-Am Daytona Prototype program would continue Toyota's sports prototype heritage in the States. Toyota-

powered prototypes dominated U.S. road racing in the early 1990s, including a win at the 24 Hours of Daytona in 1993.... Looks like *Porsche* lovers will get something new - Porsche plans to add a 180-mph coupe—conceived along the lines of its discontinued 928—that will share major pieces (such as a front-mounted V8 engine) with the Cayenne sport/ utility vehicle. Apparently, plans for the 928 successor have been under way at Porsche's Stuttgart technical center since January. This model likely will be built alongside the Cayenne and Carrera GT supercar at Porsche's Leipzig plant.Rumor has it the new car will debut by late 2007....Jaguar's "postponed" F-Type mid-engined two-seat sports car status seems to have been settled by Ford chief executive Nick Scheele. "It is uncertain whether the F-Type would ever make it into production," Scheele says. Suppliers on the project have mothballed their work. "We'll lose the people that have worked on it and with the inevitable legal changes, when we start again, it'll be from scratch," said one. Jaguar chiefs have said the F-Type could still be built—but some years after its originally scheduled '05 introduction date.... With the loss of Firebirds and Camaros to modify for the factory, what is tuner SLP to do? Wouldja believe modifying and selling between 3000 to 5000 Ford Ranger pickups next year, dubbed Thunderbolts?! Believe it!.... **Trumpeter**, the company hard at work on the '60 Pontiac converti-

ble, is reportedly finished with that

project, and is set to begin work on the *Nova* in the mid-July time frame. They hope to have a resin master at the Chicago hobby show in September! The Monte Carlo has also been located and should also be photographed by the time you read this, with tooling to begin immediately thereafter.... Talking Hondas?! IBM recently announced that it signed a deal with Honda for a navigation system to be offered on '03 Accord models that will include voice recognition software and a small touchscreen. It should make it easier for drivers to find the closest gas station or restaurant by simply asking the car's computer for help! Boy, talk about a guy's worst enemy! Asking your CAR for directions?! Whats the world comin' to?! ....200+ mpg VW! Yup, Volkswagen's latest project combines highly tuned aerodynamics, exotic materials, and a HUGE 0.3-liter diesel engine to achieve this feat. It has cameras for rearview mirrors, faired-in wheels, carbon-fiber bodywork, and the single-cylinder, four-stroke engine uses monoblock construction (no separate cylinder head), and is all aluminum, with dual overhead cams operating two inlet and one exhaust valve. The engine produces a 'thundering' 8.5 hp., weighs only 57 pounds (!), and is attached to a six-speed gearbox. The car was actually driven by Ferdinand Piech, VW chairman, from Wolfsburg to Hamburg (110 miles), averaging 264 mpg in the process! No word on when we'll see it in the U.S....

#### **Directions**

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT

695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
