


14 Years and Still Going Strong!

1967 Pontica® GTO™

[AMT/ERTL #31764; 1/25th scale; 87 pieces; gray, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires]

The Great One. Known by several names over the years, the Pontiac GTO is credited with starting the modern musclecar movement in 1964. By 1967, the body started moving toward the coke bottle shape of the soon-tobe-introduced 1968 GTO (also chosen as Motor Trend's Car of the Year), seemingly getting longer and leaner than the boxy 1964 that started it all. Of note in 1967 was the loss of not only the 389 cubic inch V-8, but Pontiac's trademark tri-power as well. Not to worry though, as a stout 400 cubic inch V-8 replaced the 389, and the addition of an HO option almost made the loss of tri-power bearable. That said, let's examine this good news/bad news proposition.

Engine: The 19-piece engine (either stock or supercharged) thankfully, does away with the axle through the engine block syndrome that plagued modelers for years. The two-piece block has a separate, two-piece transmission, and separate oil pan. Chrome valve covers mount onto the heads, and the builder's choice of stock, cast iron exhaust manifolds or headers are provided. A chrome round element air cleaner tops this unit off.

Chassis: The chassis is a fairly shallow plate with little engraving. It features two sets of axle holes in the rear, in order to get the right 'attitude' on your Goat. The ex-

haust system, rear axle, and differential are all molded as a single piece.

Wheels/Tires: Wheels consist of your choice of either the new Rally II, or a

turbine style deep-dish wheel reminiscent of something you would see on a custom van. Tires included are along the same lines – BF Goodrichs. These are mounted to the car by plastic axle stubs up front, and a metal axle in the rear. A big surprise here is that the tires are safely encapsulated in a bag, along with the taillights and metal axle.


Body: The only separate item

here would be the hood and bumpers. In contrast to newly-tooled kits, this one does not feature separate door handles, wipers, chrome trim, or even outside rear view mirrors! It features a GTO script molded onto the quarter panel, 'PONTIAC' script on the taillight panel, and a molded 'pinstripe' on the top of the fender, running the length of the body. Of interest here is the inclusion of the 1970 GTO front bumper on the parts trees. What purpose does this piece serve customizing?!

Interior: The tub-style interior

is also (understandably) light in detail. This is also where some of the inconsistency comes in. It includes Pontiac's 1969/1970 style steering wheel, and 1970 bucket seats with headrests!! The car, as kitted, is equipped with an automatic transmission. The larger automatic brake pedal is molded to the dashboard, and the console top is molded as a separate, chrome piece, with separate shifter. A set of custom seats (complete w/two-piece headrests), three-piece roll bar, fire extinguisher, and Moon gas pedal are also included.

Glass: The front and rear windows are connected (barely) by a runner, and no side window glass is included. A big change here is again that this unit is bagged.

Decals: Minimal at best, consisting of two blue stripes for either side of the hood, and matching stripes for the sides of the car, as well as two license plates. Not surprisingly, the exact same decals appeared in the last version of the kit.

Instructions: The instructions are very nearly a direct copy of the original issue. With one glaring exception, that may be a result of its Mexican heritage. The original


- Johan and Lindberg were not at the show





This 'N That!

The next-to-last Chevrolet Camaro—a red T-top Z-28 fetched \$71,500 at a charity auction, as reported by The Associated Press. A 32-year-old business manager from Mayville, Michigan, said "I paid a lot more than I wanted to, but I wanted it bad." The last Camaro to roll off the assembly line at the General Motors plant in St. Therese. Ouebec, is headed for Chevrolet's museum. More than 4 million Camaros (and two million Firebirds) were sold since the muscle car debuted in fall 1966 with the 1967 model. Bye, bye, 'F' cars – we'll miss va!.... Another GM division witnessed the end of a high-profile nameplate. The last Saturn Sseries car, a red sedan, rolled off the line in Spring Hill, Tenn., on August 29. Over its 12-year production run, Saturn built 2.7 million S-series cars. The nameplate has been replaced by the Ion....August 30 was the final production day for the Mazda 626 and Mercury Cougar, both built in Flat Rock, Mich. The 626 began its production run in 1989, and 926,674 were produced. The Cougar was introduced in the 1967 model year, dropped in 1997 and reintroduced for the 1998 model year. Since then, 235,028 Cougars were produced....A new

five-passenger sport wagon called the *Chevrolet Equinox* will bow in the 2005 model year, GM said Tuesday. It will be based on the *Saturn Vue*, and available in front- and all-wheel-drive models. It is expected to replace the *Tracker* at CAMI, a joint venture of GM of Canada, Ltd. and Suzuki Motor Corp. of

Japan....Word reaches me that *Pontiac Motor Division* not only helped promote "xXx" and the *star*, a *1967 GTO* (actor Vin Diesel is the co-star!), they are also intent on

making the redesigned 2004 GTO a 'Star' in the sequel! Time will tell!... Alfa Romeo's return to the United States has been delayed again. Sources say Fiat Auto's sporty brand won't go on sale in North America until 2007, three years later than originally planned. The relaunch has been postponed twice, due to delays caused by problems developing models that meet U.S. safety and emission regulations. Fiat pulled Alfa Romeo out of the United States in 1995. They want to return to the U. S. with a full range of products - the replacements for the 147, 156, Spider, GTV coupe and a full-sized sport wagon....Seventime Winston Cup Champ Richard Petty joins legendary car designer Giorgetto Giugiaro October 18 in Dearborn, Michigan, as the only two living

inductees of the 2002

Hall of Fame field.

The honored field also includes deceased auto veterans Giovanni


Agnelli, the founder of

EULINUX

Fiat; Frank McCarthy, the former president of the National Automobile Dealers Association; tire company founders Andre and Edouard Michelin; and Chrysler engineer Owen Skelton. Giugiaro,

who is already a member of the European Hall of Fame, is noted for designing more cars in the 20th century than any other designer. His designs

include the BMW 3200 CS (1961), the *Fiat 850 spider* and Dino coupe (1965-1967), the Maserati Ghibli, De Tomaso Mangusta, the Lotus Esprit, Volkswagen Scirocco, DeLorean DMC 12, Saab 9000 and Lexus **GS300**. His daughter is managing director of the family-controlled Italdesign-Giugiaro SpA, and his son has taken over the styling and prototype studio. Petty is known as a pioneer of Winston Cup racing who is the all time record holder of NASCAR wins with 200 - seven of which came at the Daytona 500. In the 1967 season, Petty won 27 of 48 races, including ten consecutive victories....In the apparently never-ending battle for control of the shape of the *Cobra sports car*, a press release issued by Superformance International Inc., a South Africa-based maker of replica Cobras, following an August 21 ruling by a federal judge in Boston: "Carroll Shelby

has no Trade Dress Rights in the Shape of the Cobra." Or, this from Shelby: "Carroll Shelby Continues to Take Aim at Cobra Replicar company in Trademark Infringement Case." He calls the ruling "just another bump in the road." Essentially, U.S. District Judge Rya W. Zobel dismissed Shelby's case against Superformance regarding alleged counterfeiting of the trade dress, or design, of its replica Cobras. Shelby called the court's findings "encouraging," because the judge "recognized the true design history of the Cobra." "We've

been dealin' with these issues for over 20 years, but we won't rest until we expose all of these knock-off parts makers for what

they truly are." Guess that means Shel plans to appeal....V-8 Caddies! By now, we all know that the 2004 XLR roadster will have a Northstar V-8 under the hood. The Northstar will also power the 2004 SRX sport wagon. The SRX shares its vehicle architecture with the Cadillac CTS sedan, which makes the CTS a candidate for using the new Northstar engine in the future. No comment from GM....A year after Chrysler executives announced plans to build the Crossfire, engineers are busy testing preproduction cars in the States and Europe in preparation for a manufacturing start in January 2003. German builder Karmann will assemble the car, making about 11,000 in the first year of production—increasing to 20,000—with most of those earmarked for the North American market. Look for the first cars in U.S. dealerships by late next spring.

The resemblance to Mercedes is no coincidence: the car borrows nearly 40 percent of its parts from Chrysler's German partner,

including a 215-hp 3.2-liter V6 linked to a six-speed manual or five-speed automatic transmission....One owner, low mileage – really!! I had the pleasure recently of seeing Luke Skywalker's Land

> for 'only' \$13,100 (Yup, you all missed it)! It is powered by a 'reliable' 1988 Escort four-cylinder backed by an auto-

matic tranny, is titled as a Ford, and has *only 880 miles* on the odometer (since being rebodied).

The side jet pods are adjustable (for driving) and removable (for storage).

Never know what you'll find on eBay!....And, speakin' of eBay, a

'Museum quality' 1968 Mercury Cyclone 'race car' model recently sold there for \$1,200!! The car was a Pro Street style build, with fabbed floorpans, stainless steel chassis, twin funny car style cage, a 698 cu. In. Jon Kaase replica Boss, topped off by a 3-stage Dupont red and black paint job, polished to perfection. Build time


was listed as six months. That equates to *just less than seven bucks an hour, if he worked 24/7!!*....GM plans to build up to 40,000 *retractable hardtop*

Pontiac Grand Ams for 2006. A sedan version is expected in 2004, followed by a coupe in 2005.... Not just another

pretty face! 20 coats of candy red paint applied over custom body panels, wrapped around leather seats, and powered by a Magnuson supercharger (which ups horsepower to 490!), and you have the Avelate Corvette. Go to http://avelate.com/ for more info....Pontiac recently unveiled the 2004 Grand Prix. A new competition package includes 17-inch wheels, tuned suspension and Stabilitrak Plus, and TAPshift (TAP stands for Touch Activated Power), which switches the car from automatic transmission to

> manual with a Formula One-style paddle lever on the steering wheel. The supercharged V-6 is also uprated to 250 hp....And, while on the subject of

Pontiac, Pontiac GM Lynn Myers said engineers are making two changes to the upcoming GTO's powertrain. One will increase low-end torque so that the sports coupe delivers better zero-to 60 performance. The other is to the exhaust system. "In Australia, it's a very quiet car. We are putting some Pontiac exhaust note in it." "Yeah, Baby!"





instructions displayed the MPC logo. What AMT/ERTL attempted to do was to merely replace it with their own. However, their spell-checkers/translators failed to in-

form them that Pontiac is spelled **PONTIAC**, not **PONTICA** (Hence, the introduction to this review)!


It should be noted here (not to sound as though I am defending

AMT/ERTL, 'cause I'm not) that this kit is a straight reissue of the original tool, which was bad to begin with! Why is it so bad? As noted above, this kit actually includes several pieces from the 1970 GTO produced by the nowdefunct Model Products Corporation (MPC), that were bought up by AMT. Given the 30+ year-old technology utilized, and the errors as packaged, this kit is almost not worth the plastic with which it is molded. It amazes me how this one compares to the Revell 1966 GTO. I sincerely hope that the manufacturers read this review. IMHO (In My Humble Opinion!), the manufacturers must feel that if a kit has been tooled once, regardless of its age, a brand-new tool of the same subject would not sell. Ouite the contrary, I hope to tell va! A perfect example is the aforementioned Revell 1966 GTO. The tooling advancements since the MPC 1966/1967 GTOs were produced have yielded an excellent replica, while at the same time 'stretching the envelope.' Elimination of the tub-style interior in favor of a floorpan and separate side panels; separate windshield wipers, door handles, and mirrors; and even a decal sheet containing all body scripts, allowing the builder the option of how to handle them, are just a few enhancements to illustrate my point. Guess I'll be in the market for more of the Revell 1966 GTOs, in an attempt to model, to the best of my limited ability, a correct 1967 GTO. Now where did I put that 1967 GTO reference material? Lyle – advice?! 🖨



Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway

(RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign.

Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
