Condolences

Ely Reeves Callaway III, the founder of Callaway Cars and father of current Callaway Cars President Peter Callaway, has passed away at the age of 75. As the son of Callaway Golf founder Ely Callaway Jr., Reeves dreamed of becoming a race car driver. However, that didn't quite pan out, and he eventually became a racing instructor at the Bob Bondurant racing school. It was during this time that he developed his first aftermarket piece, a turbocharger kit for the BMW 3

Series.

Initially kickstarting Callaway Cars from his garage, Reeves was eventually able to open an independent shop in Old Lyme, Connecticut, where he modified the likes of BMW, Alfa Romeo, Aston Martin, Land Rover, Mazda and General Motors products. That being said, some of his most well-known work was with the Corvette, like the 1989 Callaway Twin Turbo Vette.

Thanks to a close relationship with The General, Callaway Cars is

Wheels and tires are from *Geronimo Works*, stock number GW-14LTPI. Don't think twice and go out and order

some stuff from him, I mean, look at those badass things!

I had a lot of

fun putting this one together, very nice new tooled kit from AMT. If I decide to do another one, I want it to be either a Hell Cat or a Scat Pack. Either way, I know it will definitely look a lot more intimidating than this one.

1971 Olds 442 W-30 [100+ pieces, white, clear, clear red, vinyl tires, metal exhaust tips, decals]

Engine: The basic engine and transmission consists of either 28 or 29 pieces, depending upon whether you choose the automatic or 4-speed. Yup, that's correct! You have the option to equip it with a three-piece Turbo 400 automatic, or a two-piece 4-speed! The longitudinal split remains.

<u>Chassis</u>: A transmission crossmember, two-piece exhaust, steering box, simplified three-piece front suspension, and six-piece rear, with...you guessed it... another option! This time, the W-27 option! It was an aluminum axle carrier, that shaved weight from the standard cast iron version.

Wheels/Tires: There is one rim choice—the well-known Super Stock II design, which mount a single set of blackwall tires, which have white-lettered markings on the decal sheet, unless you prefer to replace them with a set of tampo-printed tires.

<u>Interior</u>: Platform-style, meaning very crisp details on the separate interior side panels. The front buckets are two pieces each, while, consistent with the engine option, two consoles and shifters

are included, to match transmission options! Meanwhile, the dashboard mounts a fourspoke sport steering wheel on a short steering column. There are decals for the woodgrain appliqués on the

dash, console, and door panels, as well as the steering wheel hub.

Body: Crisply molded, in one main piece, with separate front and rear bumpers (eight and five, respectively), three-piece rear spoiler, sport mirrors (with separate chrome faces), separate door handles and twin-scooped hood with separate hood locks (again, saving more weight). Clear head, parking and taillights are added to finish it off.

<u>Glass</u>: Simple—separate front and rear glass, as well as separate sunvisors! An inside rear-view mirror is also included.

<u>Decals</u>: In a word—incredible!! They not only include your choice of stripes—black or white—to build the car in either color combo, but so much more! Things like both dash and door

panel woodgrain appliqués. And that's just for the interior! Body scripts and wheel center cap marka few ings, small underhood markings,



white letter tire markings, and two license plates—"OLD 442" ONT and "67201" AL.

<u>Instructions</u>: Step-by-step, easy to follow, with parts identified by name and number, with painting suggestions. The last page of the instructions includes an illustration for decal placement, showing front, side, rear and the top of the car.

It is obvious that a lot of thought went into the engineering of this kit, in order to provide transmission, shifter and W-27 options. I can only hope that this will become more common with Revell kits from this point on. If it does, we all win. If you need any further proof, one look at Marcos Cruz's beautiful Viking Blue Poly rendition of this kit will be all you need to see what is possible with careful work, and attention to detail. Personally, I am digging the Lime Green Poly car on the box art, but these are only two of a good assortment of colors for this car.

Kudos go out to Ed Sexton and Revell for their hard work, and additional thanks to Marcos Cruz for *HIS* work (previously displayed). Thanks—Tim

The '24 Camaro is the final model year for the car's sixth-gen. offering a few interesting bits and pieces before it officially fades into the sunset. One of the most important of these is the launch of the new Collector's Edition, a special variant complete with unique features, including a matte black paint option.

The matte black paint is officially dubbed Panther Black *Matte* (PBM), and is tagged with paint code GNW. Critically, PBM is the first factory matte paint option ever offered for the Camaro.

PBM name is a nod to the first-gen Camaro from the '60s, specifically the program's "Panther" code name. Further Panther-themed homages made elsewhere with the Collector's Edition package. For example, it also includes PBM Tricoat paint when equipped on LT/RS, LT1, and SS trim levels, while PBM is exclusive to the ZL1.

Notably, the PBM paint on offer with the Collector's Edition package for the '24 Chevy Camaro ZL1 has the same GNW paint code as the Maverick Noir Frost pain option offered exclusively for the CT4-V Blackwing Track Edition, specifically the IMSA Sebring Edition, limited to just 99 units total. Maverick Noir Frost served as an indirect replacement for the satin Dark Emerald Frost paint offered for the '22 model-CT4-V vear Blackwing. Additionally, Maverick Noir Frost was offered for the '23 CT5-V Blackwing, once again with an identical GNW paint code.

For anyone who remembers

just how expensive Maverick Noir Frost was for the two Blackwing sedans (\$8,120 when optioned for the '23 CT5-V Blackwing), it should come as no surprise that the Collector's Edition package for the '24 Camaro ZL1 is quite expensive as well. The package alone is \$14,995, which, combined with the '24 Camaro ZL1's base MSRP and destination freight charge (\$73,695), brings us to a total of \$88,690. Of course, the package includes much more than just the paint, but regardless, the matte finish is likely a big chunk of that final total.

Orders for the '24 Camaro kicked off in June. Production begins in August.

In today's era of modern glob-

alization, it's not uncommon for companies makers being no

different. With this in mind, a recent study was performed to determine which automaker featured the most American-made vehicles. and 'GMC' wasn't included in the top ten.

According to a report from Cars.com, Tesla EVs swept the top four most American-made vehicles for 2023, while entries from Honda and VW rounded out the top ten. As for 'GMC', the Corvette was ranked as the 19th most American-made vehicle, while the GMC Canyon and Chevy Colorado ranked 33rd and 34th, respectively.

Notably, this 'GMC' ranking is drastically lower than the '22 Kogod Made In America Index, which had the Bow Tie brand's sports car ranked as the third most American-made vehicle.

C8 Watch

The mid-engine platform in the C8 is fantastic for traction, but that can backfire when attempting to show off with donuts, as demonstrated by the individual behind the wheel of the C8 featured in this story.

Making the rounds recently on social media, a video is just a few seconds long, but that's all it takes for this driver to turn their new C8 into next week's collision repair bill.

The video opens on a two-lane country road, where we see several people standing around, checking out the C8. The Vette slowly rolls down the shoulder, its headlights on during what appears to be early evening. A few other cars roll by as the Vette driver idles on the side of the road.

Suddenly, after we see a car pass on the left, the Vette driver nails the throttle, cranking the steering wheel to the left. The rear end of the car slides out, pirouetting the Vette into the adjacent lane, two black streaks left on the pavement behind it.

So far, so good. Not exactly the most

impressive display of driving skill of all time, but at least the Vette didn't hit anything. But that's when things start to go wrong.

With the steering wheel still cranked to the left, the Vette spins around until it's perpendicular to the two-lane road. The driver then stabs the throttle again. However, the throttle application isn't enough to get the rear end sideways, and instead, the C8 plows forward—right into a mailbox, barely missing a pickup truck.

The Vette luckily stops within inches of a Chevy S-10. Either way, that's gotta be embarpretty rassing for all involved. Moral of the story don't attempt donuts on public roads lined by parked cars and people.

If you're going to do something dangerous, stupid, and illegal, cre-



ating video evidence of the act and posting it online is a surefire way to make things much, much worse. Unfortunately, that's a lesson that another C8 owner in Canada learned the hard way after a video that showed him street racing against a motorcycle was posted to social media, leading to his arrest and his car being impounded.

Per a report from CTV News Toronto, 22-year-old Brampton resident Simranjit Singh was arrested on June 30th and charged with several offenses, including dangerous operation of a vehicle, racing a motor vehicle, and performing a stunt in a vehicle. Peel Regional Police state that prior to the arrest they were made aware of a video posted to social media which shows Singh racing near Steeles Avenue East and Airport Road

In the video, the C8 driver is seen taking off from a stop light alongside a rider on a green motorcycle. The two accelerate quickly, and the driver raises their left hand as the speeds climb. The individual taking the video raises the camera to show the green motorcycle start to pull ahead of the

It's worth noting that the discrepancy between this report and the Kogod study is due to methodology, as <u>Cars.com</u> uses several disqualifying factors when articulating rankings, which include:

- Models that have a gross vehicle weight over 8,500 pounds, which provides exception from AALA requirements
- Models where less than 1,000 units are produced in a model year, which provides exception from AALA requirements
- Models set for imminent discontinuation, or production

moving outside the US, without a clear US-built successor

- Models not yet on sale at the time of the study
- Models intended solely for government or commercial fleets
- Models that don't meet minimum sales or inventory thresholds
- Models with insufficient information

The above disqualifying factors rule out several 'GMC' vehicles, including the Lyriq, Bolt EV/EUV, Camaro, Express, Silverado HD, Hummer EV pickup, GMC Savana, GMC Sierra 1500 and GMC Sierra HD—Assorted sources




