












C8 Watch

The C8 Z06 and ZR1 are performance powerhouses, the Z06 featuring the 670-hp 5.5 liter V8 and the ZR1 boasting the fire-breathing twin-turbo'ed 5.5 liter V8 generating 1,064 hp. However, 'GMC' has just released a voluntary recall for 2023-26 model-year C8s over a fire risk while owners fuel up their vehicle.

According to the recall, 23,656 2023-26 Corvette Z06s and 2025-26 Corvette ZR1s which are equipped with a left-side radiator/fan combination, are affected by a condition where excess fuel spilled into the fuel-filler pocket can leak down on an ignition source.

Fuel spilling onto an ignition source, such as in this case, increases the risk of a fire.

The problem stems from the left-side radiator/fan combination found in the LT6 and LT7 engines. In rare cases, excess fuel spilled into the fuel-filler pocket can leak down on an ignition source. Naturally, this increases the risk of a fire.

'GMC's fix for affected C8 Z06 and ZR1 models involves installing an insert or shield to divert fuel that may have spilled into the fuel-filler pocket away from any ignition source. The fuel-filler pocket is the only component affected by the recall, and every unit recalled will receive the fix.

Since the recall affects the most recent model years of the C8, Chevy has pulled Z06 and ZR1 units from online inventory search while it takes care of the

recall. Shoppers will likely still be able to find units for sale on dealer sites, but buvers searching for either highperformance C8 variant on Chevrolet.com will find no units available anywhere in the US

To clarify, the Stingray and E-Ray variants of the C8 are unaffected by the recall. The 6.2L V8 powering the Stingray and E-Ray uses a different cooling system with a different radiator design than the ones in the 5.5 liter V8s, so they don't have the same risks outlined in the recall.

The C8 Z06 was once a "hot" commodity (Ed. Note: see prior news item!). Just two years ago, buyers were clamoring for build slots and were happy to pay markups for the opportunity. Now, though, it seems Z06s are beginning to pile up on dealer lots, with many available for MSRP. Some even have steep discounts. So if you've always wanted a new track-ready C8, now's your best chance.

First brought to light by <u>Carscoops</u>, Chevy currently has 1,702 Z06s sitting on dealer lots across the country, according to the carmaker's online inventory tracker tool. Of those, 1,001 are coupes, and the other 700 are convertibles.

Interestingly, the Z06 is the most populous version of the C8 on dealer lots right now. There are only 1,092 base Stingrays and 873



E-Rays currently sitting in Chevy's inventory. So if you see a C8 on a dealer lot, it's mathematically likely to be a Z06, rather than any other trim.

As *Corvette Blogger* points out, there are several reasons for the buildup of Z06 inventory. Markups from dealers likely kept buyers from swooping in right away, with the hopes that prices would go down. Then there's the mid-cycle refresh the C8 just received.

All of the cars currently in inventory are 2024 or 2025 models, meaning they haven't received the updated interior or new color choices. All of these cars still have the polarizing "button wall," which could be turning off buyers.

It's also possible buyers could be waiting for the ZR1 and the ZR1X. Whereas the 670-hp Z06 was previously the top dog in the C8 world, it's now overshadowed by the much more powerful twinturbo model, which makes 1,064 hp (or 1,250 hp in X form).

New Z06s are largely hovering at or below MSRP, according to Chevy's inventory tool. The cheapest example, a Riptide Blue 1LZ coupe, is listed for

RLC Insanity

Based on the preceding GMC Syclone turbocharged pickup truck, the GMC Typhoon featured a similar ethos wrapped in an SUV body. Only produced across two model years, the Typhoon embarrassed many high-performance vehicles of its day, so with that in mind, Mattel is releasing a *Red Line Club* (*RLC*) Exclusive 1992 GMC Typhoon.

This 1/64th scale model features a Spectraflame two-tone Apple Red and gray paint job, six-spoke Real Riders mag wheels, a full metal chassis, light smoketinted windows, and a black interior. Additionally, the hood pops open to reveal the turbocharged powerplant hiding underneath. Hot Wheels offered an RLC Exclusive GMC Typhoon in the more common Black paint scheme last year, and this is an opportunity to get a red one.

For background on the GMC Typhoon itself, this turbocharged

SUV follows in the footsteps of the aforemen-**GMC** tioned Syclone. Just like the turbocharged pickup truck, the Typhoon boasted 4 3L V6 gasoline engine, force-fed by a Mitsubishi turbo

and intercooler strapped on. To handle the extra boost, the 4.3L LB4 featured special pistons, main caps, head gaskets, intake manifolds, fuel system, and exhaust manifolds, all of which helped the Typhoon produce 280 horsepower and 360 pound-feet of torque.

This power was directed to all four wheels via the GM four-speed automatic transmission, where up to 65 percent of output was sent to the rear wheels.

During independent testing, the GMC Typhoon was capable of hitting 60 mph in 5.3 seconds and running the quarter-mile in 14.1



seconds at 95 mph. As such, many publications found the Typhoon's performance comparable to that of the Ferrari 348ts, Corvette, and Nissan 300ZX Turbo, yet still criticized its plastic interior bits. Notably, pricing started in the \$29.000 range.

This Hot Wheels model launched on Tuesday, August 12th, and shipped on or before August 22nd (likely gone!). It's available to RLC members with a limit of two per customer. As of this writing, an annual RLC membership costs \$9.99—Assorted sources





Model of the Month


The August honoree for this "official unofficial" award is *MAMA's Boy Kevin Buter* (again, if I got it right!).

\$107,464—\$12,000 off MSRP. In all, there are 10 Z06s with asking prices under \$110,000. A stark contrast to when the car first debuted, when some dealers were asking up to \$100,000 on top of MSRP.

If you want the sought-after Z07 performance package, which adds things like stickier tires, better brakes, and more aero, you'll

have to pay a bit more. But not that much more. The cheapest Z07-equipped Z06 is currently listed for \$125,790, again \$12,000 below MSRP. There are eight Z07 cars under \$140,000 for sale right now across the country.

Whether you get the Z07 package or not, the Z06 represents an incredible value here, considering its closest competitor, the Porsche 911 GT3, carries an MSRP of \$224,495—and that's before any dealer markups. Even be-

fore discounts, the amount of performance per dollar is astonishing.

Admittedly, though, that's been the C8's MO for decades now. And while the stats have gone up, the game hasn't changed—Assorted sources
