
"Kodak" Olds Delta 88

This kit is obviously based on the Monogram "Hardee's" Delta 88. It was painted with Krylon paint ("John Deere Yellow", I believe) and decaled with a combination of Fred Cady and JNJ decals. One reason this kit came together so slowly was the fact that I pulled off some detailing exercises never before attempted by me (but accomplished with the gracious assistance of Harold Bradford, Norman Veber and Jerry Flynn) (Ed. Note: At this rate, this kit could qualify as a club project!). Some of the details include:


- * molded "one-piece" 180° headers with hollowed out exhaust dumps.
- * Detail Depot Driver figure (courtesy of Jerry Flynn)
- * AN fittings and braided hose in the engine compartment (also countesy of Jerry Flynn), which complement the engine wiring
- * Driver's seat belt & craft ribbon (seat belt kit courtesy of Norman Veber)
- * Scale Model Speedway window net (countesy of Norman Veber) (Ed. Note: very nice!)
- * Stencilled Goodyear Eagle times complemented by valve stem detail (both also countesy of Norman Veber and aided by Harold Bradford)



"Kodak" Olds Cutlass

(AMT/ERTL #6731; one version; 1/25; 100 pieces; dark chrome, clear, vinyl tires)

- another "Kodak" car! It took me long enough to finish one (Ed. Note: I guess I am destined to be forever haunted by the "film" car!). All kidding aside, this will not full-blown review of the latest "Film" car. The reason being this kit (with the obvious exception of the curvaceous body!) is basically the same overall as the Rusty Wallace Pontiac kit.

The body consists of 7 pieces; basic body, hood, thunk, hear bumper, spoiler and front and rear glass. It is molded very well and with an absolute minimum of flash and is straight as annow! The front end as molded contains 7 screened-in openings-2 in the grille area, I in the driver's side headlight and 4 in the front air dam. A bit of a downer here, guys-the kit is molded in darker gray than previous offerings in the series. make it even harder to get the "Schoolbus Yellow" right. Everything seems to fit just right on my sample and best of all, the car doesn't have that "squat" look displayed in the AMT ads!

Something that was very nice of the guys at instructions contain a chart showing the team's record for the 1989 season! The decals exhibit excellent registration as well as being very colorful. To sum up, this kit has been eagerly awaited by many people and in my opinion, they won't be disappointed! Kudos and thanks to the folks at AMT! (Ed. Note: I just finished one! Do I really want to jump in and do another one?!?).

Open-faced Stock Car Driver

(Detail Depot; one version; 1/24; 2 pieces)

This driver is scaled to fit the Monogram Stock Cars. It is molded flash-free and comes in 2 pieces (head and body). particular figure has the earlier open-face style helmet similar to what is currently in use in NASCAR. Many teams however, starting to switch to the full-face style helmet for various reasons (Detail Depot carries these as well!).

Heeding some good advice, I drilled and installed piece of brass rod to make for a stronger and more 母からており合ん the head (basically, making sure his head was mounting of "screwed on" right!). I primed him, then painted him "Schoolbus Yellow" with red chest stripes (for insertion into a centain "Film" car!). The goggles and radio were picked out with black while the driving shoes and the goggles' elastic headband were done in flat white. I chose to paint the figures' hands same. 
