



1970 Dodge Superbee Pro Street

(AMT #6140; 1/25 scale, one version; 105 pieces; molded in light brown, tan, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

1970 Dodge Superbee. The Dodge equivalent to the Roadrunner as well as the Generals cars (GTO, Chevelle SS, Buick GS, and Olds 442). If one can overlook the "distinctive" front end styling, it has what it takes (in spades!) in the go-fast department (where it counted!) with engines ranging from the base 383 up to and including the King Kong 426 Hemi. The Superbee has a slightly longer wheelbase than the Generals cars (resulting in more interior and trunk space), but was priced very competitively being Dodges version of the highly successful Roadrunner.

AMT has announced two versions of this particular car, a stock version due out in early 1993 and a Pro Street version currently hitting the hobby shops which is the one that I will address here.

The flash present on the body and a few trees lead me to believe that this is a modified reissue. A quick check of a vintage Auto World catalog did, in fact uncover a 1970 Superbee (#1770) listed by MPC (remember them?) for the paltry sum of \$2.00! One obvious difference would be the hood. The old MPC kit utilized the small scoop with two openings centered on the hood while the latest AMT hood is flat. Before going any further, I shall mention that this kit cannot be built stock without. Enough of the right pieces are missing which would allow the builder to construct and/or kitbash a Replica Stock without some work.

The body, as noted above, includes a separate hood which is flat (devoid of any hood scoops molded in or added on), which will need to be cut out (on the scribed lines) for engine clearance. The twin Superbee hood scoops are conspicuous by their

absence. a small rear spoiler is also included.

The engine of choice (the only choice!) is a tunnel-rammed 426 Hemi (Ed. Note: Those four little letters demand respect!) comprised of comprised of either 22 or 26 pieces depending on the air cleaner option chosen. These include a Weiand-type triangular air cleaner set-up or a velocity stack w/air cleaner set-up. This engine is backed by a 4-speed tranny which is consistent with the large pistol-grip shifter found between the seats. Of particular interest is the well done DOHC Hemi (an actual picture of it appears on the side of the box), In reality, this consists of the top end of the engine (cylinder heads, valve covers, single four barrel intake, and fan belt assembly) which mount to the engine in lieu of the stock parts. I applaud the gang at ERTL for including this interesting option to the kit. Also missing for a good Replica Stock version are the stock exhaust manifolds and dual exhaust system, although the factory tailpipe tips are included. ERTL did provide the stock multi-carb oval air cleaner even though it goes unused in this kit. The headers and "shorty" exhaust system are identical to the Pro Street GTX (as is most of the chassis).

The interior is tub-style, and consists of 10 pieces. These include a nice pair of Recaro-style buckets (no stock buckets), the stock dash and steering wheel, and a 3 point, 3-piece roll

The chassis (which is molded in tan) appears to be lifted directly from the Pro Street GTX with some minor mods to the rear suspension mounting while the body portion is molded in light brown. Changes were also made to the 4-bar rear suspension mounting. Also conspicuous by their absence are wheelie bars of any type (to keep this beast in touch with good ol' Terra Firma!). Firewall and inner fenders attach to the chassis as does the radiator wall (which mounts...drum roll, please!....the radiator!). The radiator keeps this beast cool via 2 radiator hoses (upper and lower). Of note here is the presence of the stock rear end and leaf springs.

The wheels are identical to the Pro Street GTX, being a Centerline-type wheel (big and bigger). The big news here is the inclusion of drum roll, please a new set of tires! Specifically, big and bigger Mickey Thompson Sportsman S/S tires which look to be very nicely done! I can forsee many people buying this kit just to get those tires for their Pro Streeter,

Rod or whatever!

The decal sheet includes both black and white Superbee stripes and emblems, "Mopar Muscle" and "KILLERB" Georgia tags, as well as a "Mickey Thompson Performance tires" decal.

The instructions are good in the typical AMT fashion in that they identify all parts by name. No painting suggestions are

given for the body due to the colorful nature of Pro Street machines, so the builder is on his own here.

This kit is an interesting addition to your Pro Street lineup, especially with the new Mickey Thompson tires. The lack of stock parts is not a problem, since the stock Superbee is scheduled to arrive in May. I can't wait!


Making that troublesome grass for dioramas:

On a particular project that required a large area of scale grass, I spent weeks wracking my brains to come up with something that would look more realistic than the flat expanse of HO Railroad-supplied materials that is most common.

I remembered reading about making weeds out of fishing fly material and went to a local sports center and realized that most of the "weed" looking material was nothing more than deer tails in a bag. Well, if deer fur worked for weeds I reasoned, why not

a bigger fur for a full lawn?

I eagerly purchased a yard of fake fur at a Cloth store, making sure it looked like real fur with tan and brown in it. Cutting off what I needed, I was able to shear it down in the same manner that a Barber cuts hair-by lacing the flat of my hand under the material and laying the scissors flat on top and cutting off the excess length. The beauty of this is that you get a very heavy coverage, and you can clip it in such a manner as to have high and low spots giving you the appearance of how grass really grows, at different rates. You can take the left over trimmings and make them into bunches of longer, dried weeds, or sprinkle it on top to simulate dried, cut grass.
