

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes!

* 1967 Plymouth GTX (Revell #7359): Molded in Blue Metallic (Ugh!)....great looking 19-piece Hemi....upper, lower radiator hoses and plastic heater hoses!...most chrome trim separate (door handles, windshield wipers, gas cap, mirros, hood ornament)...really nicely engraved chassis with separate exhaust system, dana rear end...Magnum 500 wheels....decals include redlines for tires...instructions include color matrix chart. (Ed. Note: Way to go, Revell! I can't wait for the "Sox & Martin" version!).

1994 Dodge Ram 2500 Pick-up Truck

(AMT Snapfast Plus kit, 1/25th Scale)



It seems lately that I have been in a rut doing kit reviews on our simpler friends- you know, the snap kits. Not that there is anything at all wrong with these kits, but much of my time lately is being devoted to a 1:1 resto project, the total restoration of a 1936 Buick Century, so I have not had adequate time to build what I love, the complicated 1/25th scale truck kits.

Anyway, back to the basics here. AMT has produced a very simple kit here, mostly a curbside kit with only 28 pieces molded in high gloss black, chrome, red and clear plastic, and textured gray for the interior. However, don't be deceived by the quality of this kit based on the low parts count. It is an exquisite kit with truly state-of-the-art detailing, especially on the one-piece chassis.

I am going to spend more time on the chassis than the rest of the kit because it is a work of art. Too bad this kit did not come with a complete engine and opening hood. The chassis clearly shows the lower fan shroud, front torsion bar, oil pan with drain plug, starter motor, auto transmission, detailed driveshaft, dual exhaust with twin catalytic converters, muffler, tail pipe, fuel tank, and spare tire with custom wheel and lug nuts. How can so much tool and die work go into a single piece? Probably because the plastic bag it was tightly wrapped in was clearly marked CHINA.

One lesson ALL manufacturers could learn here is the packaging technique used here by the Chinese. The body of the truck was in a bubble pack plastic wrap, with every individual component or set of parts individually wrapped. The wheels were plastic wrapped, the windshield plastic wrapped and taped tight, and all the interior parts were wrapped. In fact, there was not one single piece of sprue in the entire kit. All parts were neatly trimmed and wrapped like the butcher used to do!

I would highly recommend this kit for anyone's truck collection. By the way, did I mention the opening tail gate? I didn't think I did!

Kenworth Aerodyne

(AMT Snapfast, 1/32nd scale)

I was awarded this kit at the February MAMA meeting to do a kit review, I expect because I am a truck builder in 1/25th scale (Ed. Note: Give that man a kewpie doll!).

Upon opening this kit it seemed to have adequate parts bagged in AMT's usual fashion, and I was actually surprised to see waterslide decals

(something Revell Snaptite could pay attention to!). The instructions were clear, printed in large letters, indicating that this kit is mostly for beginners, and was in 16 stages with most stages containing two or three uncomplicated steps. I would suggest that the decals be placed on the truck first, rather than last, as shown, because most young builders would have a

problem doing this with the truck fully assembled.

Overall the truck exhibited good engraving and moderate detail, but having built some truck kits with more than 500 parts, this one was 'child's play'. In fact, I made a game out of it to see how fast I could assemble it, not using the directions and it was together in about 12 minutes. There was no painting necessary, however if you are into 1/32nd scale kits this truck could be made very presentable with body color, some detail painting such as the marker lights, grille, etc. The 'snap' fasteners on this kit were round pegs in round holes for the most part, whereas Revell's round peg/square hole system works a little better. Many of the parts were fragile, and I could see where small, inexperienced hands could casily break parts off trying to press-fit them, and some parts fit rather loosely and actually could have been glued to make a more positive fit.

Bottom Line...This kit was designed for kids, but the fact of the matter is that the kit is too fragile for a toy, may be too advanced for the very young who would certainly break it playing with it, and was no challenge for anyone with even short term experience. It did however, have the ability to teach beginners how to follow directions, use waterslide decals, and maybe interest them enough to advance to more complex kits down the road. Ages 8 and up was the recommended audience, and I would follow

this recommendation.

Chevrolet Caprice 4-door Taxi/Fire Chief

Revell Snaptite kit #6294, 1/25th scale



This kit was somewhat of a surprise to me because for several years now I have been preaching to the Big Three (Chrysler's not involved here) that they should do a 2 in one or a 3 in one kit with a four door car to include a Taxi Cab and a Fire Chief car. Hmmmm, maybe someone out there is actually listening. The result was a crisp, clean kit of a late model 4-door Chevy that is a reissue of the recent police package car with electronic lights.

The box has some very nice artwork/photos on it to aid in building and the kit is very crisp and clean with regard to mold lines. Unlike many of the more expensive Japanese snap-plus type kits where there is no engine, this vehicle has a very detailed engine consisting of 11 parts which is fairly nice for a snap kit. There are separate firewall, master cylinder, exhaust system, cruise control module, 5-piece rear suspension, 1-piece front suspension, and radiator. This could very nearly be considered a glue kit if one pretended hard enough. The interior has separate door side panels, which is a blessing even for the adult builder when it comes to paint and detailing. There are radios for the Fire Chief car along with a nice light bar and spotlight. The taxi version includes a meter, roof light, and clipboard. Transfers for the Taxi include the side door rate chart, checkerboard stripe and taxi logos, while the Fire Chief version includes Chieggs Fire Doot Potallica 14 transfers includes Chicago Fire Dept. Batallion 14 transfers.

This kit was obviously geared to the younger builder as it is a snap kit, molded in a bright yellow and includes stick-on vinyl markings (Yuck!). But I am not going to complain too loudly because it is a taxi and they are rare! I suppose the idea behind the bright yellow plastic is so the younger builders won't have to get sloppy with paint, but this obviously won't apply when building the 'red' Fire Chiefs' version. These are my only two complaints. I sincerely wish Revell would shy away from using vinyl transfers as they are useless and not very effective when trying to

Overall, it was a great kit and necessary for the Light Commercial builders, worth the purchase price and I hope to see more of this type vehicle. Remember Revell DECALS are in order here, scrap the vinyl

always, if one of these "floats yer boat", get on down to your local hobby shop and order it as that's the only place you will find these




