

Sneakin' a Peek!



This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes!

* '94 Mustang Cobra Indy Pace Car (Monogram #2975): Molded in Red..... correct Cobra emblems, front air dam and rear spoiler....correct Cobra rims and 4-wheel disc brakes....2 intakes included, regular GT and Cobra....convertible boot and up-top included....Indy light bar also included....pace car graphic decals included.

* Ford Louisville Short Hauler (AMT #6460): Molded in Lt. Gray molded flash-free with bright, even chrome....cargo box with roll-up rear door and power tail gate....both amber and red MARKER lights...minimal decals consisting mainly of stripesfor cab, (2) Iowa plates, "FORD" and "Frigiking" logos.



1965 Ford Mustang Shelby GT350R

[Monogram #2969; 1/24th scale; 74+ pieces; white, chrome, clear (unbagged), (8) vinyl tires]

The 1965 Shelby Mustang was one of the most requested kits by Ford enthusiasts and Monogram finally listened, producing both '65 and '66 street versions as well as a Hertz "Rent-a-Racer". While all these Mustangs were transformed into potent street-legal special production vehicles at Shelby American's assembly line and race shop, only thirty-six 1965 Shelby GT350's received the racing modifications which turned them into Corvette killers. This kit represents the "R" (for Race) model which looks like its street counterpart but differs in several ways. Let's see how the kit

updates compare to the differences between the real cars.

The most distinctive feature of the race version is its front valance. The kit replicates this piece which was designed to save weight and house openings for brake cooling ducts fairly accurately except for the dimensions relative to the front fenders. A more exact part is available from Replicas & Miniatures Co. of MD but the body can be modified to be more precise. The rest of the body is unchanged from the earlier street versions including the MUSTANG emblems which should be removed. The correct gas cap cover plate and special Plexiglas rear window are included, the latter detail most probably inhibiting many modelers from attempting a street to race transformation.

The interior includes some of the race-specific parts such as the racing seat, six-gauge panel, and four-point roll bar. The steering wheel is almost correct but should not have a Cobra emblem in its center. The rest of the interior is stock which needs to be "race readied" by removing the window cranks and ribbed door panels. An extra wheel to mount on the rear shelf in lieu of the spare tire cover would have been nice as well.

The radio and glove box also require surgical removal.

Under the hood is a nice representation of the high performance 289 engine with an aluminum intake and headers. The carb is very simple but the velocity stack covers it anyway. The Monogram 427 Cobra kit carb looks a lot more realistic and adding an aluminum air cleaner on top would be a great improvement. The molded-in battery is definitely incorrect and belongs in the trunk. Lastly, the Cobra oil pan, although nice looking, is wrong for the real car. The racing engine had a rather plain Avaid largecapacity pan to keep the high-revving 289 properly lubricated, and the valve covers are missing the long oil tube welded on. Don't forget to sand off the horns on the radiator brace, although they may have come in handy to warn the competition that they were about to be passed.

The American Racing 15 inch wheels are beautifully chromed and even include valve stems. Paint the centers metallic and mount the Goodyear sports car special tires (two sizes and sets of four included) to complete

this ready to race car. Thank goodness no more Michelin TRX tires.

Despite my nitpicking of this kit, I applaud Monogram for recognizing a special interest race car as being worthy of additional tooling. I recommend this model to any Ford fanatic that doesn't mind doing a little extra work to build a nice replica of the most successful showroom-available race car money could buy, except for possibly a 289 Cobra!
