



Sneakin' a Peek!



This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

* '95 Ford Mustang GT (AMT #6200): Molded in Lt. Gray....re-hash of excellent '94 kit....front and rear windows, quarter windows frosted for nearly non-existent....decals include black paint....flash underhood markings, "GT" emblems, "BLAZE" MI plate & "MY GT" IL plate, & high-mounted brake light....typically excellent instructions w/color matrix and parts identified by name and color....excellent box art showing photos of a real chrome yellow GT on the lid along with engine and interior shots on sides of box.

* '95 Ford Mustang Cobra (AMT #62012): Molded in Lt. Gray....Correct Cobra intake and front bumper as well as 5-spoke Cobra wheels....decals include underhood markings, "VENOM" MI plate, and

"COBRA" IL plate....see '95 Mustang GT for remainder.

* '70 Plymouth AAR 'Cuda (Revell #7601): Molded in Limelight Green....Revised reissue of <u>Dodge</u> <u>Challenger</u> <u>T/A</u>....all correct AAR pieces (hood, 340 six pack motor, reverse flow exhaust system, etc.)...interior tub features separate, drop-in 'Cuda doo panels...molded plastic heater hoses for engine...black and white AAR stripes, "Mopar Nats" window sticker, "340 Six Barrel" air cleaner decal, "DAN 48" CA plate...box art features real car on lid and build-up on sides. 
Regardless of qualifying speed, Dale Earnhardt must start 10 laps 1. down.

(Modelhaus; 1/25th scale; 16 pieces; tan resin, chrome, clear and red, all parts bagged to prevent scratching and scuffing) (A bag 'o bags)

This is my first attempt at building a resin kit. I bought the 1960 Ford for high school memories (both attending and kit build times). I bought the Modelhaus kit (\$45.00) based on their reputation for quality, ease of assembly, and a built example I spied at NNL East.

Engine and Chassis: None. The Modelhaus catalog suggests using the 1957 Ford kit. My initial check shows the chassis is fine for closed hood (kit hood molded closed), but the frame (in my opinion) is too short otherwise. Since I want to build an open hood mild custom, I plan to use a modified '65 Ford chassis.

Interior: The interior consists of 3 pieces: tub-style interior, dash, and steering wheel. The interior tub has nice detailing despite one-piece molding including bench seat. The interior has the convertible mechanism wells. The dash has nice detail. I really want bucket seats in mine but have not researched an interior alternative. The steering wheel requires the most clean up of the whole kit.

Body: The body consists of 8 pieces: body, hood (molded closed), front grille/bumper, rear valance/bumper, 2 red tail lights, 2 front fender trim pieces, and 2 vacuformed windows (front and rear). Scripts, hood, and trunk emblems are nice (easy on the paint-they were also easy to sand off). Compared to other resin providers I have seen, the flash is minimal. Body thickness is typical big three. There appears to be only one light sink mark on the top of the right rear fender. The windows are OK. I have little vacuformed experience but Denbigh Hobby Center (Newport News, VA) has higher standards in this area.

This leaves 4 parts unaccounted for: 4 1960 stock wheel covers. All chrome pieces are nice!

Decals: None.

<u>Instruction</u> sheet: None. I have to believe that most can figure out where the parts fit together.

In conclusion, I am glad I bought this kit and am now working on chassis, engine, and interior choices. The kit as is with a '57 Ford chassis does make a nice looking stocker.

1970 Plymouth AAR 'Cuda

(Revell #7601; 1/24th scale; one version; Lime green, clear, chrome, vinyl tires)

What do you get when you cross a Monogram 1970 Challenger T/A with the desire to create a new Barracuda kit? Why, you get Revell's "new" AAR 'Cuda, that's what! This eagerly-awaited kit may disappoint many people.


Read on to find out why!

To start with, it is a modified reissue. It looks very much like Revell took the Challenger molds and attempted to modify them enough to end up with the 'Cuda. Well, this is difficult when you realize that the wheelbase of the Challenger was 110" while the Barracuda rode on a slightly shorter 108" wheelbase. Consequently, the top appears to be "chopped" because of this difference in length. In examining the molds, this kit has all the "right stuff" so to speak (the 340 six pack motor, the correct exhaust system, proper scooped hood, etc) but if you hold the Monogram HemiCuda up alongside the Challenger, the differences become obvious. The reissued AAR 'Cuda is about a quarter of an inch longer than the Hemicuda. Also, the rear window has the incorrect shape of the Challenger rather than the 'Cuda. Upon closer inspection, Revell even goofed and left the Challenger's hood scoop and rear tail light area on the trees. They did do a nice decal sheet with both black and white stripes on it as well as an air cleaner decal and "DAN 48" CA plates.

The worst part of all of this is that it will be quite a job to even use a Monogram Hemicuda to convert the existing Challenger/'Cuda into a reasonable facsimile due to the fact that everything is slightly larger to look "in scale" on the Challenger. For example, the nice, scooped six pack hood is not only too wide, it is too long as well! Ditto with the unique

exhaust system due to the extra 2" in wheelbase.

I guess we either take the 'Cuda and build it out of the box (and don't look too close) or wait for someone to master a correct body. Sorry Revell, you dropped the ball on this one!




