



## Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- #94 "McDonald's" Thunderbat T-Bird (Monogram #1701, 1/32 Snaptite): Molded in Black....Reissue of the Penske Racing South T-Bird....still has chrome wheels (even though box art shows black ones!)....colorful "Thunderbat" vinyl markings.
- #94 "Mcdonald's" Thunderbat T-Bird (Monogram #2469, 1/24th scale): Molded in Black....Reissue of older T-Bird (down to and including '83 grille & headlights on chrome tree)....bright chrome tree including wheels which will need stripping....fair amount of flash and seams due to age of tool....due to use of older body, roof flaps are missing....colorful, apparently complete "Thunderbat" markings (including screened-in openings on front end).
- #3 "Goodwrench" Monte Carlo (Monogram #2447): Molded in Black...glass still not wrapped, but at least it's placed in the bottom of the box

beneath decals & instructions....glass is frosted on the rear, side window included, roof rail molded to rear glass....rear bumper is molded to body along with spoiler ('way too thick!)....roof rail appears to interfere with operation of diagonal roof flap!....no fan on engine, instead unit attaches to radiator....front air dam separate, with one opening in it (with chrome grilles for it and the grille opening)...bright chrome tree....same excellent chassis including upper and lower radiator hoses and adding new oil cooler lines....rocker panels appear to roll in a bit too much....typically excellent instructions naming parts and colors....colorful decals include "trademarked" #3 as well as Bassett decals, NASCAR approval dot for windshield and "tire rub markings" (Ed. Note: Gee, I wonder why?)!

- #4 "Kodak" Monte Carlo (Monogram #2448): Molded in Yellow....decals include wheel hubs, Bassett decals, NASCAR windshield approval dot....see Goodwrench for remainder.
- Thames Panel Truck (Revell #7609): Molded in Emerald Green....Opening hood, side, and rear doors....period M+H Racemaster slicks....acetate included for windows (along with templates for same in instructions)....injected Olds engine with upper and lower hoses....nice instructions....smooth, bright chrome.
- #18 "Interstate Batteries" Monte Carlo (AMT #8186): Molded in Lt. Gray....reissue of earlier Lumina....chassis pan lengthened somewhat, new upper chassis crossmember added....window braces, rails molded in, separate NACA duct for driver's window, vented quarter windows (no ductwork)....Goodyear Stock Car Special tires w/chrome 9-hole Bassett wheels (Exactly how long ago did NASCAR stop running chrome rims, anyway?)....decals apear complete, down to and including "Bassett" and tire marking decals.
- #5 "Kellogg's" Monte Carlo (AMT #8187): (See "Interstate Batteries" Monte Carlo above).

• #24 "Dupont" Monte Carlo (AMT #8190): (See "Interstate Batteries" Monte Carlo above).



1995 Chevrolet Blazer (AMT/ERTL #8978; Nearly new tool)

AMT/ERTL has another winner in this kit. From the subject matter to the level of detail, this kit is a winner. The reason I call this kit a "nearly new tool" is that like the real 1:1 vehicle, the Blazer shares several of its' components with the S-10 pick-up, such as the front fenders, hood, grille/bumper, and doors, as well as the dashboard and windshield detail. The engine is also shared, all of which exhibit excellent detail.

<u>Body:</u> An accurate rendition of the 2-door S-Blazer, properly proportioned. All moldings and emblems are crisp, and will not be lost under a few coats of paint. An interesting note here: I have never seen a 2-door Blazer with composite headlamps or body side moldings as depicted in the kit. Whoever does the research for AMT/ERTL needs to maintain a little better contact with the vehicle manufacturer regarding accurate vehicle specifications. I will be removing the molding from the body in order to model an accurate Blazer LS. With the exception of the windshield, the glass mounts from the outside, to yield the correct flush appearance. Accessories for the body include the stock outside tire carrier, rear view mirrors, luggage rack, and aftermarket grille guard and winch.

<u>Engine</u>: A well detailed and engraved 19-piece rendition of the 4.3 liter Vortec V-6 CPI engine and 4L60E automatic transmission. The engine is unique in that the engine/transmission are divided into upper and lower halves, instead of left and right. This feature, along with separate accessories and accompanying A/C pieces make for a very accurate engine when painted properly. Note: Get a GMC or Chevrolet truck brochure for an accurate color photo of the engine.

<u>Wheels/Tires:</u> Chevrolet's 5-spoke aluminum wheel and Goodyear Wrangler Mud & Snow tires are depicted here, with an optional Centerline-style modular wheel. Note that the wheels are chrome plated in the kit, whereas on the real vehicle are painted light argent for the factory wheels, so they should be stripped and painted with the proper silver paint for a more accurate appearance.

<u>Interior:</u> This assembly builds from the floorboard and is very well detailed. The seats are 2-piece affairs which are accurate for the Blazer. Both front and rear seats are separate units as well as the console, door panels, and dashboard assembly. Follow the instructions for painting and assembly and with some care will yield a beautiful interior package.

<u>Chassis:</u> A 20-piece assembly which when completed accurately depicts a 4-wheel drive chassis. The front suspension unit, while not posable, and simplified, has separate assemblies for the front drive axle, and transfer case. The rear suspension is comprised of a 2-piece rear differential, leaf springs, and shock absorbers. A separate exhaust system is also included. Front disc brakes are also included, but curiously, rear brake detail has been omitted. Underhood detail includes the A/C plumbing and associated pieces, separate brake reservoir, battery, windshield washer and overflow reservoirs, ABS module, and vacuum chamber. Exactly how do they get all that stuff under the hood?!

With some patience and attention to detail, this kit will yield a beautiful replica of a 1995 Chevy Blazer. I highly recommend this kit.





1995 GMC Sonoma SLS pick-up (AMT/ERTL #8109; Modified reissue)

I will make this review short and sweet. This is the same excellent kit of the Sonoma we had last year with the same minor inaccuracies (S10 seat upholstery pattern molded in, body side moldings, and decal stripe color-white instead of silver or red).

Changes for 1995 are as follows: an air bag for the steering wheel and a reversed wheel pattern, which is accurate for the truck pictured on the box, but inaccurate for a two-wheel drive truck, as these are four-wheel drive wheels. Last year's stock wheels would have sufficed. I intend to convert the truck to four-wheel drive using the suspension components from the 1995 AMT/ERTL Chevrolet Blazer. Therefore, I might use the wheels after all.
