The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

• '96 S10 LS Sportside (AMT #6188): Molded in Lt. Gray...modified reissue of S10....same Vortec V-6....instructions spell out painting tips for 5-spoke wheels, but wheel choices are limited to 10-hole aluminum or 5-spoke ZR-2 style 4X4 rims....interior/exterior color matrix



included....platform-style interior....separate tailgate and rear bumper complement new stepside box...."SPORT" IN, "96S10" MASS plates, instrument cluster, emblem decals.

• '87 T-Bird combo set (Monogram #6392): Molded in White (!)....separate nose, rear bumper....nose approximates Davey Allison's/Alan Kulwicki's cars (Elliott, Schrader to a lesser degree)....engraved "THUNDERBIRD" lettering, smoothed headlight doors, large, rectangular opening with smaller, screened-in opening centered...majority of kit unchanged (new closure panels)...new glass, quarter windows...'83-'86 grille and headlight doors blocked off on new chrome tree....decals include white Goodyear tire markings, seat belts much like their newer releases.

JANUARY: Jack Rousch adds a twelfth car to his team in an effort to keep up with Rick Hendrick's fourteen-car team

MARCH: Fans and crews were irate when they missed the "Miller 600" in Richmond because they were still stuck in Atlanta trying to leave the parking lot.

APRIL: After the Blizzard of '96 broke up the concrete on the half mile track, Bristol rebuilds as a three-mile, 55 degree banked turn clay oval. Dave "Pappy" Marcis is unofficially clocked at 273.31 while testing Goodyear's new 24 inch wide tire.

MAY: Memorial Day-Six different live Indy car races were shown on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN3, ESPN4, ESPN5, and ESPN6, while TNN covered the Charlotte 1200, still the longest race in NASCAR. Humpy Wheeler has the Legend cars run on the little 1.5-mile inner track during caution flags on the 4-mile octagon-shaped track.

JUNE: Dover, the only three-mile track with a horse track and a state university in the pits, announced a new policy for next year. No campers of any kind during race week will be allowed (the tent campers sued and won).

JULY: Seats for the 2021 Talladega 1000 are now on sale. Send your certified check for \$650.00 (bleacher seats) or \$950.00 (tower seats) in today. Only 400,000 good seats left.

AUGUST: Bill Elliott wins the "Winston Billion" after winning the "Suzuka 500 by Honda" in Japan, the fourth of the "Big Four" international races required to win the bonus.

SEPTEMBER: At the "southern 500", a 100-lapper on the five-mile, egg-shaped oval in Darlington, a secret drivers' meeting was held and the drivers agreed to pull out of the race so that Michael Waltrip could win his farewell race, after 1185 starts. While unloading, the car rolls off the top ramp of the hauler and cannot be repaired in time for the race.

OCTOBER: The Monte Carlo has won the last 115 races with their "stock-appearing" 82 inch wide rear deck lid. Ford was allowed to lower their roofline 1/64th of an inch and the Pontiacs 1/32nd of an inch to keep them competitive.

<u>NOVEMBER:</u> Dale Earnhardt wins his 14th championship with owner Richard Childress, leaving him now only three behind leader Jeff Gordon, who won ten championships in a row, and fifteen of his seventeen with owner Richard Petty.

<u>DECEMBER:</u> At the Winston Cup banquet in Switzerland, it is announced that the racing season will expand from 40 to 42 races, with new, six-mile, one and one half million seat tracks being built in Canada and Greenland (still no ovals on the west coast)

<u>Type:</u> 1937 Chevy Modified asphalt race car. There are two different ways to build this car. Take off the slicks and add the tires from the Monogram Sprint car kit and you now have a dirt track car for guys that do it in the dirt like *John "Hog out those wheelwells" Kester*.

Engine: The kit comes with a 427 big block Chevy V-8 hooked to a 4-speed trans, modified Hurst shifter, Vertex magneto, Holley 4-barrel carb, and Stahl headers (Ed. Note: Jeff, you name dropper you!)

Chassis: A standard Tobias tubular chassis with a full roll cage found on most of your current dirt and asphalt race cars. Features of this chassis are the Frankland Quick-change rear end, two-point link suspension, Koni coil over shocks, and ATL fuel cell.

<u>Body:</u> your standard '37 Chevy body all hacked up to make the car lighter for more speed. The hood is removable, or it may be glued in place.

Wheels: Halibrands both front and rear.

Tires: 2-piece Goodyear asphalt slicks front and rear.

<u>Comments:</u> I am looking forward to building this kit. I myself will most likely build the Dirt track car.

# 1996 Corvette Grand Sport Roadster



(Monogram #2452; 1/25<sup>th</sup> scale; one version)

This kit is a modified reissue of Monogram's excellent glue-type corvette kits dating from 1985. I have mixed feelings about this kit, in that the subject matter, engraving, detail, and assembly is very good, but there are a few inaccuracies, possibly due to cost-cutting, which I will cover in this review.

Rear Body Assembly: This unit is molded in Medium Blue Metallic which is more than a few shades off from the actual Admiral Blue color used on the actual car, so painting is necessary if you intend to build a Grand Sport, or any '96 Corvette for that matter. The body itself has been updated with the correct '95-'96 gills on the front fenders. On the rear deck area, the mold lines are a little heavier than normal, so a little filling and filing is necessary to eliminate them. The overall engraving and body shape seems to be on the mark. The white stripes and red hash marks are done with decals.

Firewall assembly: Deeply engraved with a separate brake booster and master cylinder.

Interior assembly: Bucket-style with separate door panels, featuring good door handle detail, and updated to current specs. The 2-piece bucket seats are accurate, as well as the airbag-equipped steering wheel. The dashboard also features nice engraving, but unfortunately is missing the turn signal and tilt steering wheel stalks. The pedals are molded to the floorboard, which will be lost under paint or flocking. They should be a separate assembly.

Chassis: The chassis features separate front and rear suspensions, 'X' brace and exhaust system. The engraving is very accurate with fuel and brake lines molded in. The exhaust system and upper and lower suspension control arms are chromed, and this is totally inaccurate. These parts should be dechromed and painted with the appropriate finish to be accurate.

Engine: The engine is the normal Monogram late Corvette style with the transmission, driveshaft, torque bar, and differential molded in one unit, split in half, resulting in a seam in the oil pan, transmission, and differential which will require attention. Several of the engine's accessories are chromed, and again, this is inaccurate. These items should be finished in black or the appropriate metalizer finish to be correct. One note: The engine, when assembled and properly painted, will depict the LT4 engine of the Grand Sport, but the auto transmission is inaccurate as the only transmission available is the 6-speed manual. The correct tranny is in the ZR-1 Corvette kit.

Wheels/Tires: These consist of the 5-spoke aluminum wheels, which should be painted black with an aluminum rim to be correct. These mount onto the Goodyear Gatorbacks, which while they look good, are wrong for this car. Come on, Monogram, tool up some GS-C's for the Corvette similar to the Camaro and Firebird. The disc brakes look good when mounted.

Overall, I liked this kit, and since it is the last in a series of Corvettes, I will buy several as it can be used to depict not only the Grand Sport, but also the Collector Edition, as well as any other Corvette Roadster with a wheel change from the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary kit.



<u>Type:</u> 1964 front-engined dragster. There are several different ways to build this kit. I myself cut the body to make the first dragster that Shirley Muldowney drove to get her class A driver's license.

Engine: The kit comes with 392 cubic inch V-8 with estimated horsepower of 1,250 (on 85% nitromethane). My kit however, is powered by a small block Chevy with fuel injection.

Chassis: Tube-type chassis with a wheelbase of 150 inches, and a ground clearance of 4 inches.

<u>Body:</u> The body in the kit is molded in clear and must be painted from the inside, and therefore a clear coat is unnecessary.

Wheels: Halibrand mags on the rear and bicycle wheels on the front. Comments: This kit is great for building into a dragster from the 60's.

The latest issue of the <u>Blueprinter</u> arrived on my doorstep yesterday, and they have some neat stuff on the way such as <u>Series 3</u> of the "Buyer's Choice" program which will include the '70 Impala SS454, '28 "Gangbusters" Lincoln, the '33 Willys van, and the International Transtar Eagle II, as well as the '63 Corvette coupe diecast in Sebring Silver/red interior, and the '69 GTO Judge in Liberty Blue/White interior. - The New Dodge! Took the family to see <u>Twister</u> the other night. One of the main characters drives a new <u>Dodge Ram extended cab</u>, which made a neat commercial for Dodge, 'cause one of the many twisters they encountered in the movie <u>pushed the Dodge around</u>, but I think the Dodge got the best of the <u>first</u> confrontation. And, speakin' of Chrysler, the good news is that they are developing an <u>all-new vehicle</u> (not the Prowler!) which will be built at the Newark, DEL plant (<u>rumored to be a sport-ute</u>). The bad news is that they aren't going to produce the <u>beautiful</u> · <u>Chrysler Atlantic show car</u>.
- Ol' Shel is at it again! A recent interview in the <u>USA Today</u> detailed some of his plans for the immediate future.
