




Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- '70 Impala (AMT "Buyer's Choice" #6172, 1/25th scale): Molded in Lt. Gray....straight and reasonably flash-free....'fat block' with your choice of single 4-barrel, fuel injection, or tripower....optional custom valve covers and headers....nicely engraved chassis includes separate 2-piece exhaust system w/optional stock or custom resonators....5-piece front/7-piece rear suspensions....optional, lowered kingpins for front end....(4) Goodyear blackwall tires, (2) Goodyear slicks which mount either stock wheels, Torque Thrust 5-spokers, or Cragars....tubstyle interior....underside of hood has a huge scribed cutout for injectors....custom front and rear ends.
- Chevy Van w/Race Car #7250): Molded basically unchanged except hitch....nice, new trailer which mount white wagon rims....twin axle trailer red tail lights....separate tire chocks....trailer license plate decal even included.



Trailer (Revell white....van reissued for addition of trailer has (4) TRX tires wheel-style w/fenders and clear ramps, tire rack, and


- Harley-Davidson Electra Glide (Revell #85-7306, 1/12th scale): Molded in Lt. And Dark Gray....crisp and flash-free....nice engraved detail on engine and chain....fairing and all lenses clear....brake tubing and cutting template included.
- '65 Chevy Stepside pickup/Hemi Hydro Combo (Revell #85-7249): Molded in White....Pickup appears to be knocked off of excellent '64 pickup, w/obvious exception of wheelbase and stepside bed....whitewall tires mount chrome rims/baby moons....Hemi-Hydro and trailer included (unchanged)....water skies also included...."Dean's Marina" decals, vintage license plates, boat name ("Maxine") included.
- '65 Impala SS (Revell #85-2470): Molded in White....new 8.25-14 Goodyear Power Cushion whitewalls....SS hubcaps with separate spinners....all lenses (head, parking, dome, instrument cover!) clear, clear red tail light lenses....mold seam across rear of trunk to attend to....molded in "Super Sport" and "396" emblems, separate door handles, wipers, and mirrors...platform-style interior w/2-piece dash, 3-piece steering wheel assembly....separate chrome console and 4-speed shifter....2-piece front buckets, rear molded in place w/separate chrome grille in the

middle....22-piece 396 motor w/air cleaner decal....a/c equipped, including separate a/c hoses!....front and rear suspensions are 9 pieces each....2-piece exhaust system....front bumper separate from grille....body seams even appear to be correct!....Oregon, and Illinois plate decals, underhood and "396" decals.

- #94 "McDonald's" T-Bird (Monogram #85-2486): Molded in White....excellent modified reissue of '95 T-Bird with correct front end air inlet and air dam....very nice decal sheet including fogged 'Golden Arches' for front end, 'Bassett' wheel decals, seat belt decal.
- #88 "Quality Care" T-Bird (Monogram #85-2472): Molded in White....for remainder. See "McDonald's" T-Bird.







(Lindberg #72163; 116 pieces; white, clear, clear red, chrome, vinyl tires)

A few months ago, car modelers were pleasantly surprised to learn that a '61 Impala kit was coming from Lindberg. Rumored to be a "world class model for the adult enthusiast", this kit would provide another full size Chevy not available in plastic for the past thirty-five years. The kit is now on the shelves, and to put it mildly, it is a great disappointment. For those on a limited budget, save some additional coins to purchase the AMT '62 Bel Air which will become the donor kit for all of the correct parts which you will have to graft onto the '61 Impala. You will also need a bunch of scratchbuilding supplies to complete the work that Lindberg should have done before producing this \$13 kit. Perhaps you may want to save all of your coins and not purchase this "third-world class kit" at all!

<u>Body:</u> When the body is removed from the box, your eyes are drawn to the strange half-moon shape of the cowl. Of course, the rear edge of the hood mimics this incorrect shape and looks downright weird. Upon further examination, you discover that the molding along the left and right sides of the roof is not there. The molding starts out around the front edge of the vent windows, and

becomes even more glass is installed, are rounded and can be corrected by '62 Bel Air, the

cowl, upper doors, and rear pillars, and then grafting this section onto the Lindberg body! Of course, the AMT glass would be used instead of the round 'bubble' provided in the kit. This, in turn, necessitates reworking the dash in the interior to fit the new, correct cowl. When you are happy with all of that, you can graft some sheet plastic to the rear of the kit hood and shape it to fit.

Most modelers won't go to all of that trouble, especially after comparing the vertical height of the body to a Monogram '59 Impala and the AMT '62 Bel Air. The body is too narrow from the tops of the doors to the rocker panels, reminiscent of the original SMP offering from 1961.

One could choose to ignore the vertically-narrow body and move right on to scratch-building the top part of the grille. Ya see.....Lindberg did not bother to engrave the eight rectangular grille openings above the horizontal bars. The two outermost rectangles (if they were there) are supposed to hold the parking lights, but these are not included in any form in the kit. In other words, on-third of the grille is simply not provided in the kit!!

The chromed bumpers and tail lights are pretty nice, although the instruction sheet directs the builder to put the backup lights in the wrong place. Separate door handles are provided along with outside rear view mirrors which have deep sink holes in them. Emblems and scripts are nicely engraved, and, curiously, are also duplicated on the decal sheet, but mostly in the wrong colors!

The rest of the kit: The *chassis* is a *multi-piece affair*, and is very comparable to the AMT '62 Bel Air. The *blackwall Goodyear tires* exhibit nice sidewall detail, but the tread is rather crude.

The chromed wheel covers receive separate three-bar spinners without any provisions for the red, white, and blue color bars on the fins.

The *interior* is assembled from ten parts which are nicely engraved, but becomes a somewhat shallow assembly in order to fit the aforementioned shallow body. The *dash* has decent engraving with short, little pedals molded to the bottom. The *unique Impala steering wheel* is 'okay', but isn't quite accurate.

The *engine* is a twenty-three piece assembly, and looks to be quite accurate. Some nice underhood pieces including the firewall, steering box with shaft, and heater unit are also present.

In 1961, when I was twelve, I would have thought this was a 'killer' kit. Then again, I would have glued it together and brush painted it in about an hour, and covered it with every flame and scallop decal I could find.

A 'World class model kit"?!? Not even by 1980 standards! For a list price of thirteen dollars, we should be sending Lindberg a bill for having to scratchbuild most of this thing.

With a fair amount of guilt, I guess I'll put two of the three kits that I purchased on the club raffle table and stick them on somebody else.


1969 Chevrolet Camaro Indy Pace car

(Monogram #85-2459; 1/25th scale modified reissue; white, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

The Revellogram '69 Camaro is in its' fourth version, this time as a convertible in a Monogram box. For those of us who are fans of the '69 Camaro, this kit is a welcome addition to any

collection. Now, the '69 Camaro Pace car was recently re-released by AMT/ERTL as part of a three-car set, but the Monogram kit is superior in overall detail and proportion.

Engine: The typical monogram big block Chevrolet engine, accurately proportioned and engraved, with separate block, oil pan, bellhousing, and transmission in a two-piece assembly. Separate parts consist of the cylinder heads, intake manifold,



starter, fuel pump, water pump which all add to the overall accuracy of this engine. There is also a two-piece carburetor, two-piece air cleaner with a chromed lid, chromed valve covers, a distributor, coil, and headers. (Note: I would assume that a small block swap could be easily accomplished, seeing as how most of the street versions I have seen are so equipped-Tim Sickle)

<u>Chassis:</u> Exhibits excellent engraving, with separate parts for the front crossmember, one-piece front suspension unit, front sway bar, two upper A-arms, steering box, chambered exhaust system, rear springs, axle, and shocks.

<u>Wheels/Tires:</u> Revells' ubiquitous Chevy Rally wheels and Goodyear Polyglas GT Radials introduced in the Z28 variation of this kit. They are beautifully engraved, even though the five cooling slots seem a little narrow to my trained eye. The tire treads also seem a little shallow. A new twist-decals are supplied for the raised white letters.

Body: This is more than the traditional coupe to convertible conversion. Monogram took the time to add the 396 engine emblems, as well as the SS insignias to the sides and rear of the body. They also added the trim around the louvers in front of the rear wheel openings. The windshield frame has also been accurized. By the way, the door handles are now separate items. Monogram did an excellent job on this one.

<u>Interior</u>: Monogram must have gotten a hold of a *Tim Powers*' (a.k.a. Scale Resin Detailers) deluxe interior conversion (mastered by Mr. Willits hisself), in that the interior was totally upgraded to the deluxe interior for a convertible. Decals are provided for the orange Houndstooth inserts. I hope that in the future, Monogram will see fit to make these inserts in a clear/black background to

make other interior colors possible. The *all-new convertible boot* has a molded-in wrinkle texture, simulating a well-used boot. It has a very realistic appearance.

Other notable features on this model are the decals which are by Scale Master, They seem to be devoid of the normal carrier film at the edge of the image. Included on the sheet are two pace car checkerboard flag decals, as well as Speedway markings.

If the directions are followed, a novice can produce one of the most well-known Indy 500 Pace cars known. *Excellent job, Monogram*!



it, I saw it up in the air up, "Conner told the bull had a limp, but seemed injured! Thanks to the wire


