

'97 Meeting Schedule

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- Dodge Viper GTS Coupe (AMT #8394; 1/25th scale Snapfast Plus): Molded in Red....Typically excellent packaging....chrome 5-spoke GTS wheels which mount big 'n bigger Michelin rubber....clear headlights, clear red tail lights....twin white stripe decals, "Viper" emblems, "SNKBITE" CO, "97 GTS" NM, "VIP ER" NY plates.
- '97 Mustang GT (AMT #8224): Molded in Lt. Gray...modified reissue of '96 GT, but with the corrected 5-spoke wheels (box art rims do not match rims in the box) and body work...powered by correct 4.6-liter, 215hp SOHC V-8....(4) underhood decals, "GT" fender scripts, CHMSL, "PONY GT" IL, "GRAZEN" MI plates.
- '97 Mustang Cobra (AMT #8231): Molded in Lt. Gray....28-piece 4.6-liter 305hp DOHC V-8....correct tail light pods mount clear red tail lights (2 pieces per side)....Cobra-specific front bumper, hood, and rear spoiler....(4) underhood decals, snake fender emblems, "SNAKE I" MI, "SLITHER" IL plates.
- "Raybestos" Ford F-150 (AMT #8242): Molded in Lt. Gray....19-piece 358 cu in engine....tires appear to be the only carry-over item in this kit, and are somewhat flashed....they mount 9-hole open slotted rims....chassis includes brake ducts for the front end, mufflers attached to exhaust system...9-piece quick-change rear end....disc brakes all around....separate brake/clutch reservoirs....'97 Ford F-





150 body appears very slick, smooth, and accurate....all major decals, but builder is tasked with painting yellow to red fogging along truck sides.

Dodge Ram VTS pick-up

(Revell #85-7617; 1/25th scale; 87 pieces; White, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

The Dodge Ram pick-up. You either love it, or you hate it. Well, in the case of the *Ram VTS* pick-up, stuffed full of the monster 400 hp, Viper V-10, you just gotta love it! Possibly sensing this, Revell planners decided to kit this outrageous vehicle for the modeling public. I'm sure many of us are glad they did!

<u>Body:</u> The cab and body are molded as one piece, with the rear cab wall a separate item. The lower rear edges of the pick-up bed behind the wheels are separate items. The tailgate is a two-piece unit. The mirrors are separate, and include separate chrome faces. A hard tonneau cover for the pick-up bed is provided. The hood includes two hood hinges. The front end is completed by an unchromed grille, and the air dam, which will receive not only clear driving light lenses, but their covers as well! The headlight buckets are chrome, and are covered by clear lenses. There are clear red tail light lenses to bring up the rear. The only real thing missing here is the high-mounted stop light over the pick-up cab's rear window-guess you are on your own with this one! It is a very thin red strip running nearly the width of the window.

<u>Interior</u>: The interior is tub-style, but particularly well done. It includes separate, drop-in door panels, a two-piece seat, two-piece dashboard (along with a clear gauge face cover), a nice fat-rimmed Dodge steering wheel, a separate pedal assembly which mounts to the floorboard, and a two-piece floor shifter.

Engine: The V-10 engine consists of only ten pieces, but looks to be very well done, and accurate. It features a longitudinal seam, with an oil pan to partially mask it. The valve covers and intake are separate pieces, as are the front cover, fan belt assembly, and the headers. Ignore the instructions to paint the majority of this assembly Gloss Black-the article on this brute in Motor Trend shows the engine as being painted much like the Viper's-red intake and all.

<u>Chassis:</u> The chassis is a nice, ladder-type unit, with the gas tank and front inner fenders molded in. Separate upper A-arms, simplified lower front suspension, chrome front disc brakes, two-piece radiator (and upper radiator hose), are a few highlights. The rear suspension is seven pieces in all, with the inner wheels giving the impression of rear drum brakes- a nice touch! Add to this a driveshaft, and a three-piece exhaust system (separate, chrome tips mount onto a one-piece system).

Wheels & Tires: The truck comes equipped with the correct 5-spoke chrome Viper GTS Coupestyle wheels which mount five, yup (5) Goodyear Wrangler RT/S tires. The actual concept truck ran on BF Goodrich Comp T/A HR4 tires. I am unsure if the street version of this truck runs the Goodyears or not. No matter, they look good.

Glass: The glass is frosted on the rear for the black areas. Sunvisors are molded to the windshield. The rear window is a fixed, non-sliding unit. Also included on the clear tree are a dome light, headlight lenses, and parking light lenses and covers.

<u>Decals:</u> Minimal, consisting of all the white striping, 'RAM VTS' insignias for the leading edge of the front doors, an instrument cluster decal, and a 'RAM VTS' license plate.

<u>Instructions:</u> Typically excellent, with all parts identified by name and color suggestion. Extra warnings are present when helpful to clarify an assembly procedure, and they seem to be done in a straightforward manner. They also have a good decal placement guide for all the decals necessary to replicate this particular truck (although, there aren't many!).

I for one am very glad that the gang at Monogram-Revell decided to kit this truck. It made my job easier, because I had intended to kitbash the AMT GTS Coupe with the Ram to build this kit. Now, I can use the AMT Ram for a different project! If I was to nitpick this kit in any way (other than the lack of the high-mounted brake light), it would have to be that there is no provision for replicating the unique pool ball shifter (white ball with a blue stripe running left to right)! Recommended!

"Raybestos" Ford F-150 Super Truck

(AMT #8242; 1/25th scale; 100+ pieces; Light Gray, clear, vinyl tires)

One of NASCAR's advertising themes, "Hotter than Asphalt" would be very appropriate when applied to the Craftsman Truck Series. Many Winston Cup and Busch Grand National teams have some association with a truck team on the circuit. Monogram started the ball rolling with the release of the "Goodwrench", "Diehard", "Total", and "AC Delco" Chevy trucks, and AMT has returned fire with the new Ford F-150. And, contrary to popular belief, this is not a re-tool of the AMT Thunderbird-it appears to be an all-new kit!

Engine: The 358 cubic inch V-8 closely resembles the one in the AMT "QVC" Thunderbird. It appears to have a new oil pan, belt/pulley unit, and new headers sans thermal tape. The unit is pieces in all. There is no chrome in this kit, so the builder can now paint things in their proper colors and shades of Metalizers without having to strip them first. Thanks, AMT!

Chassis/Interior: In a word-incredible! The wheelbase appears marginally longer than one of AMT's latest Winston Cup Thunderbirds (as it should be). The nine-piece front end consists of a tie rod/stabilizer, lower A-arms, springs, spindles, disc brakes, and separate front brake ducts with tire guards. The fourteen-piece rear suspension is a nice looking *Halibrand quick-change unit* along with separate shocks, springs, and torque arm, not to mention disc brakes as well. Other items include a transmission crossmember, driveshaft loop, driveshaft, a two-piece radiator with both upper and lower hoses, and a separate oil line/filter assembly, seat with a separate headrest, and steering box.. And then you have that mass of tubing otherwise known as a roll cage! It is made up of what appears to be about twelve pieces, and has padding molded to it in all the right places. The dashboard is a two-piece affair, with three gauges molded in (no gauge face decals). A steering wheel is connected to the dash via a separate column. Of note here is the *separate window net*, as well as the *separate brake and clutch reservoirs*.

Wheels & Tires: Light Gray plastic open, nine-hole Bassett wheels are included which mount the same old Goodyear Stock Car Special tires. An interesting point here is the method of mounting the wheels onto the truck-the center hub actually is a pin inserted through the wheel and into the disc brake unit to retain the assembly.

Body: The body and cab have been joined and properly smoothed. Four light ejector pin marks are evident on the inside of the cab roof, but should be easily attended to and will most likely be covered by the roll cage anyway. The rear cab panel is a separate piece. A note here-care in positioning this piece will be necessary as it does not have a positive method of mounting. The front clip is also a separate item, with the grille, headlights, and screened-in openings molded in. A two-piece bed cover is included, under which you will find clear fuel filler and overflow tubes residing. The rear spoilers are separate pieces as well.

Glass: Front and rear windows, along with a side window which looks suspiciously like a vent window, are included, along with clear fuel filler and overflow tubes. The front window has the braces molded to it, while the rear window has holes in it through which the frame rails pass.

<u>Decals</u>: All major sponsor decals are present, as well as several which the builder is directed to install in the underhood area. Very nice airbrushed renditions of the head/parking lights and tail lights are also included. Unfortunately, AMT does not include tire markings as Monogram does, consequently, their Stock Car Special tires are not correct. The builder is tasked with painting the red to yellow fade on the side of this truck.


<u>Instructions:</u> The instructions are what we have come to expect from AMT. They are straightforward, step by step, and easily understood. They also identify each part by name, as well as giving the builder painting suggestions, as well as a diagram for decal placement.

At least for now, this is the only game in town for you guys with Ford Blue in your veins. It appears to be an excellent effort from the gang at AMT that captures not only the excitement of the NASCAR Craftsman Truck series, but the lines of the all-new Ford pick-up as well. There are no guarantees that Monogram will do the new Ford truck in their NASCAR line-up. So, you guys who only build Monogram stockers, give this one a look-see, and you might be pleasantly surprised!


