



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

- **Dioramas:** Tractor Shed containing a weathered car; a Salvage Yard containing cars, trucks, tow truck; a Dirt Track with a damaged car rolling over; a weathered car with a tree growing in the engine compartment; and a burned car.
- Racers: a '66 Buick Enduro car; a '39 Chevy Coupe dirt tracker; 39/40 Ford Coupe/Sedan dirt trackers; NASCAR 49 Ford; 70 Chevy; and a Cutaway Petty Pontiac.
- Muscle Cars: '65 Shelby GT-350 convertible; '65 Chevelle SS396 convertible; and a '64 Dodge (equipped with a Viper V-10).
- Trucks: '64 Chevy and '53 Ford tow truck conversions; and a Pro Street NASCAR Chevy Super truck.



The following items were actually found on accident reports submitted by policy holders to their insurance companies. Hope you get a chuckle out of it-I found it on the Internet!


- 1. The other car collided with mine without giving warning of its intention.
