July 19th August 16th September 13th October 18th November 15th December 20th From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- 1967 Chevrolet Impala SS427 (AMT/ERTL #8207): Molded in Lt. Gray....18-piece fat block, complete with separate alternator bracket....absolutely beautiful chassis with separate floorpan, includes multi-piece front suspension (looks to be posable), 10-piece rear suspension....platform-style interior w/separate door panels, rear seat, and 2-piece front bucket seats....upper and lower radiator hoses and heater hoses included....4-piece dual exhaust system....clear headlights along with front and rear windows....'427' air cleaner decal, "TB427" IA, "SS427" KS plates.
- 1997 Corvette (Revell-Monogram #2490): Molded in white....(4) incredibly nice, soft O-rings masquerading as tires....chrome 5-spoke wheels....Small block, Torque Tube, and Transmission 2 pieces, with longitudinal seam....upper and lower radiator hoses....tub-style interior with separate, drop-in door panels....2-piece bucket seats....2-piece dash w/clear gauge face cover....disc brakes at all four wheels....separate clear and clear red lights and lenses....separate outside mirrors with chrome faces.
- John Deere Motorsports Grand Prix (Revell-Monogram #85-2492): Molded in White...nice, new Superspeedway Grand Prix body...new tires....colorful John Deere Motorsports decals include lighter Green on sides, hood, and roof of car, headlight decals, 'Goodyear Eagle #1' tire decals, and seat belt decal...new valve covers w/separate heat shields...electric fan molded to fan shroud. Roof flaps present in roof...windows feature rails molded in, and frosted areas for black paint.
- 1953 Corvette (AMT/ERTL #8314, Snapfast Plus): Molded in White/red interior....(4) Firestone skinnies, w/hubcaps....glass/window frame molded as one piece....2-piece dash, with upper portion including tops of door panels....right and left-hand seats....separate, plated head, tail, and parking lights....separate rear view mirror, grille, and front bumper....'53-STYLE' CA, '150-HP' OH, and 'ROADSTR' TN plates (still undersized?)
- "Goodwrench" Chevy Truck (AMT/ERTL #8243): Molded in Lt. Gray....nearly identical to the Ford with the exception of the Chevy body and 'Goodwrench' graphics....pick-up bed lines present, compared to none on the Ford.
- "Ortho Lawn & Garden" F-150 Truck (AMT/ERTL #8304): Molded in Lt. Gray....re-hash of 'Raybestos' truck reviewed a few months ago in newsletter.
- T-Bird Legends combo (Revell-Monogram #85-6857): Molded in white....#21 Neil Bonnett/#15 Benny Parsons....separate front clip w/separate, chrome grille....older, correct Goodyear tires mounting chrome, slotted 5-hole wheels....chrome too bright....chassis virtually identical to '83 T-Bird....door lines present-some had 'em, some didn't....decals include all major markings, Goodyear white tire markings, windshield tint band, and really nice gold foil #21 numerals for Hodgdon car!
- '55 Chevy stepside pick-up Pluspack (AMT/ERTL #8598): Molded in a deep Metallic Burgundy....6-color paint set w/brush and non-toxic glue....full glue kit....chrome Edelbrock valve

- covers and air cleaner....dual exhausts w/Supertrapp mufflers....5-spoke mags mounting Goodyear VR-series rubber.
- '67 Shelby GT 350 Pluspack (AMT/ERTL #8599): Molded in Red....stock Shelby 5-spoke mags mounting Firestone tires....again, 6-color paint set w/brush and non-toxic glue....full glue kit....white Shelby stripes.
- '95 Viper RT/10 Pluspack (AMT/ERTL #8655): Molded in Yellow.... again, 6-color paint set w/brush and non-toxic glue....full glue kit....'28M519'MI, 'Viper RT/10' plates, red or white 'Viper' window tint band....big 'n bigger Michelin XGT-Z tires....dark-tinted head/parking light lenses....great painting instructions.
- '96 Corvette Grand Sport Pluspack (AMT/ERTL #8643): Molded in Dark Blue.... again, 6-color paint set w/brush and non-toxic glue....full glue kit....white stripes, red fender hash marks, 'GS' logos, 'BLAZE' Hawaii, 'LT4 V8' KS plates....big 'n bigger Goodyear GS-C's....no chrome, wheels can be properly painted....bad flash in spots.

Corvette Grand Sport

(Accurate Miniatures #5000; 1/24th scale; 100+ pieces; Light Gray, clear, vinyl tires, photoetched parts)

In the early 60's, Chevrolet unveiled the *Corvette Grand Sport* and opened the eyes of the racing public. Accurate Miniatures has thoroughly researched this particular edition (one of several), to present an unusual collector's model; a piece of racing history.

This kit should be number one on your list for an "Out-of-Box" competition. Excellent injection moldings, thorough list of painting directions, and an overall excellent representation of the era.

ENGINE: a 377 ci. In. Small block Chevy sporting four beautiful Weber carbs, photoetched header gaskets, over-the-frame headers and side pipes. **CAUTION**: Linkage and fuel lines are extremely fragile-I ruined mine. The block, bellhousing, and trans are not separate pieces. Linkage doesn't fit correctly, nor does the fuel harness. This engine should be in a Highboy or a fat-fendered Coupe. Excellent metalizer finish on wheels and assorted parts.

CHASSIS: Don't get me started. A valley is cast into the chassis rails as a stiffener, and you have to fill the bottom of the entire chassis. Couldn't it have been put on top? All the rest of the parts are beautifully done, and some are very fragile. No front coil springs, serious cutting and drilling. No shocks up front either. The rear is super. The calipers and rotors are to die for. Provision has been made for rolling wheels and posable steering. Funky spare tire. All of the parts are a tight fit. The interior is sparse, competition-style, with photoetch seat belts. The dash is another work of art. Decal gauges.

WHEELS & TIRES: The wheels are a perfect representation of the period coated with metalizer. The tires are excellent, but mine were sway-backed. To even out the tread area, I had to eliminate the tread and then some. Careful, there are two sizes of wheels, don't mix them up.

BODY: Many add-on scoops makes it ugly, but that was the experimental nature of the period in racing evolution. The body is well-done, crisp detail, with a good finish. It is a real pain to remove the castin oil cooler for adding the superdetailed kit piece, but it is worth it. Door opener guys will have a fight on their hands. I didn't try it on this one, maybe next time. Great door handles, photoetched hood louvers, windshield wipers, accessory lights for the car numbers, remote oil filter, on-board hydraulic jack fittings, gill slits, and air relief holes in the body, and optional headlight fairings. Overall, an excellent piece.

GLASS: The windows need some polishing, but all fit well. Optional clear headlight covers. DECALS: White racing stripes, a few contingency stickers, dash and gauges, and valve cover placards.

INSTRUCTIONS: The drawings are fair, some parts were omitted from the illustrations, the timing chain cover is shown upside-down, and the writing needs some work. Extremely detailed painting instructions including a cross reference list of paint makers' stock numbers.

SUMMARY: This is not a Skill level one kit. To accurately reproduce the car, one needs more research, several test fittings, great care in separating tiny parts, and the patience of Job. Special care must be taken in separating parts from the trees. The tabs are large by model kit standards and placed in bad locations. The potential for greatness is there. Step up and try one of these if you are a Corvette collector.

Given enough care, a treasure can be discovered here. I would give them a 'B' for their efforts, and two thumbs up for tackling this unusual example of automotive history.



1967 Chevrolet Impala Super Sport

(AMT/ERTL #8207; 1/25th scale; new tool; 98 pieces plus a decal sheet)

As I write this review, I notice that has been almost a year since AMT/ERTL made the announcement that they were going to produce this kit. Well, it's finally here, and I have mixed feelings concerning the detailing of the various elements of this kit. While some details are definitely world-class, some aspects of this kit leave me a little flat.

The *eighteen-piece engine assembly* goes together pretty well. You will notice that the alternator has an upper bracket, a nice touch, but the molded-in ignition coil, and the non-descript distributor and carburetor detract from the overall quality look of this assembly. In my opinion, this assembly begs for some aftermarket detail parts to liven it up.

The *chassis assembly* is *incredible*, in that this is one of the few kits to have a separate frame assembly. The front and rear suspension assemblies are both well detailed. The floorboard includes the trunk floor and fuel tank. The interior builds from the floor with the firewall/front floor assembly at the front, separate side panels, front bucket seats, and rear seats which are well-engraved. The instrument panel is lightly engraved, so light coats of paint are necessary to maintain the detail. There is a clear cover for the gauge panel, which is a nice touch. The steering column is molded to the dash, as are the brake and clutch pedals. The steering wheel, console, and shifter round out the interior. The well-engraved firewall

assembly has a separate brake booster, steering shaft and box, and heater hoses. The radiator and core support are also well-engraved with a fan shroud, upper and lower radiator hoses for the engine, and the battery.

The *exhaust system* consists of four pieces for the left and right exhausts, with pipes, mufflers, and resonators.

I have compared the new kits' *body* with the original kit, and I can say that they are not the same. The new body has been treated to the advances in model kit design over thirty years, such as a better fit for the glass assembly, separate windshield wipers and hood trim for the center ornament and the front of the hood. Positive locators for the front and rear bumpers are also present. The overall shape of the body seems perfectly proportioned in that the shape of the '67 Impala is right on the money. The proper body separation points are also in place. With all this perfection, a nice touch would have been separate door handles, and slightly heavier engraving for the emblems. The grille has separate, clear headlamps, which is a vast improvement from the previous incarnation o this kit.

The wheels and tires consist of the venerable Chevy Rally wheels and AMT's Firestone wide oval tires, which are correct for this vehicle. The builder has the choice of flowing red or white paint into the recess on the tire, either of which would be correct. Shallow brake and inner wheel detail is present, which is totally hidden once assembled.

AMT/ERTL has done a very good job with this kit. Can we say possible contender for Kit of the Year?! I would have to say that this kit is a strong contender in that the average modeler can build up a beautiful model with patience and care in assembly and painting, and there is enough there for the super detailer to go to town as well with selected aftermarket and scratchbuilt parts. You'll see mine soon. It will be *Butternut Yellow trimmed in black (Sorry 'bout that, Lyle!)*.


