

erom the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- "Raybestos" Ford F-150 race truck (AMT/ERTL #8164): Molded in Lt. Gray....virtually unchanged from earlier version, except for '97 markings.
- "Goodwrench Service" Chevy race truck (AMT/ERTL #8451): Molded in Lt. Gray....Again, virtually unchanged from earlier version except for '97 markings.
- Sting Ray III (AMT/ERTL #8309; SnapFast Plus): Molded in beautiful Deep Purple Metallic, nearly swirl-free!....great-lookin' wide 'n wider Stingray III rims in aluminum (not chrome), mounting a set of big 'n bigger Goodyears with a nice asymmetrical tread pattern....clear red tail lights....nice disc brake rotors at each wheel....bottom line-nice kit, once you get past the box art!
- 40th Anniversary Corvette set (AMT/ERTL #8325): Molded in Lt. Gray....AMT's excellent retooled '57 Corvette, along with their new '97 Corvette in one box....chrome rather than aluminum wheels in '97, mounting Goodyear EMT tires....roof molded clear as part of windshield....clear red tail lights....beautifully engraved dash/steering wheel....platform-style interior....engraved 'Corvette' lettering on rear bumper, engine intake covers....nice, crisp engraving in '57, some seams to remove....platform-style interior....stock hubcaps mounting Firestone 'skinnies'....finned, chrome 'Corvette' valve covers....grille molded open....chrome windshield frame w/integral wipers....no brake detail at wheels.
- Exotic car set (AMT/ERTL #8584): Molded in Lt. Gray....AMT's Viper GTS Coupe, Jaguar XJ220, and Lamborghini Diablo all included in the same box....Diablo (white) includes 15-piece (chrome!) 12-cylinder, as well as 5-hole rims and disc brakes at each wheel, and clear turn signals/tail lights....XJ-220 (gray) includes 14-piece twin-turbo V-6, clear roof, clear red tail lights....Both Lambo

and Jag use no-name set of big 'n little tires....GTS Coupe (Gray) includes a 23-piece V-10, big 'n bigger Michelins, chrome 5-spoke GTS wheels, platform-style interior, white stripe decals, 'Viper GTS' plate decal.

STING RAY III CONCEPT

(AMT/ERTL #8309; 1/25th scale SnapFast Plus; 42 pieces; Purple Metallic, silver, ray, clear, vinyl tires)

The Stingray III. Chevrolet's styling exercise a few years back toying with the idea of a rearmounted transmission. Apparently, they were pleased with what they did,, as the new C5 has exactly this arrangement. Revell-Monogram did a full-glue version of this kit a few years ago, and upon receiving this new AMT version, was curious as to how they would execute this kit.

Engine: None-this one's a curbside.

Chassis: Basically, a flat plate with reasonable, molded-in detail. The usual 'Licensed by GM Design Center' appears on the chassis in plain sight. The good news is that it is in an area where it can be easily removed. Disc brakes, with drilled rotors, appear at each corner! The special quad exhaust outlet in the rear is silver.

Wheels/Tires: The unique tri-spoke Corvette wheels, in two different sizes, are silver, rather than chrome (Yay!), and seem well-represented. They mount onto some equally as nice Goodyear tires, again, in two different sizes, with a unique tread pattern.

Body: The body consists of four basic pieces -the main body, front and rear fascias, and rear spoiler. The mirrors are additional, with separate, chrome mylar faces. Clear lenses are included for head and parking lights, as well as clear red tail lights.

Interior: Platform-style, with drop-in door panels, one-piece bucket seats, two-piece dash w/instrument face decal.

Glass: Windshield, head and parking lights, and clear red tail lights are included. A little paint on the windshield frame will set it off.

Decals: Restricted to the aforementioned instrument face, and chrome mylar for the outside mirror faces.

Instructions: Typically excellent AMT of late, with a capsule history, along with simple assembly instructions, especially regarding the two different rime sizes, uni-directional tires, and brake caliper/rotor orientation. No painting instructions are included, since it was molded in the proper colors (or something pretty close!).

Box Art: The box art doesn't do this car justice. The color is not as nice as the color the car is molded in, and the box art car appears to have chrome wheels, which the kit doesn't.

In all, this is a really nice curbside. If you can get past the box art, it shouldn't be a bad kit. I am attempting to remove the mold lines and polish out the plastic-I'll let you know how it goes!


GTO 1964-1968by: G. Hippolt-Squair

The GTO-the car that started the musclecar craze in earnest. There have been annual kits produced of this car for nearly every year of its eleven year lifespan (no GTO kits were produced for 1973 and 1974). Reference material is probably one of the most important things for any modeler in the successful completion of a good Replica Stock kit. Now, with the release of this book, Dream Weaver Publishing is taking direct aim at modelers needs with the material contained in this book.

The book is broken down by years, covering 1964 to 1968. I understand there will be a second volume to cover model years 1969 to 1974. It includes text descriptions of the various areas of concern (engine, interior, exterior, etc.), which describe some of the subtle details which could otherwise be missed. These descriptions also give some idea as to color choices for these items. To highlight this, there are diagrams detailing interior seat patterns, door panel patterns, and most importantly, drawings of the body showing placement of scripts and logos. Probably the best part of the book is the color chips. There is a page in every section with color chips available for that particular year! There is also an interior/exterior color matrix chart, delineating which interior colors were used with which interior colors, and convertible top colors are thrown in to

inner door panel is painted metal. Not quite-the entire door panel is vinyl-backed cardboard. This should not detract from the excellent overall presentation of this 55-page book. 1997 PONTIAC FIREBIRD TRANS AM CONVERTIBLE

(AMT/ERTL #6317; 1/25th scale Snapfast Plus; 39 pieces; yellow, black, chrome, clear, vinyl tires)

I picked this one up from Ron Bradley on a lark. I had just about finished up my Pro Street '71 GTO, and wanted to see what this one looked like.

Engine: None-this one's a curbside.

Chassis: A nicely-engraved rendition of an F-car chassis. Disappointing is the location of the "Licensed by GM' marking (in plain sight).

Wheels/Tires: A nice set of chrome five-spoke rims, which mount onto Goodyear tires via metal axles. It attaches to the body via four screws.

<u>Body:</u> The body consists of only four pieces-basic body, front and rear fascias, and the upper rear deck. The outside rear view mirrors are missing. The 'Trans Am' logos are also engraved on both doors.

<u>Interior:</u> A tub-style affair, consisting of only five additional pieces-two bucket seats, dash, steering wheel and shifter.

Glass: The windshield had the sunvisors molded to it, and I merely masked it and painted the frame black. The tail light is also molded in clear, with a decal which mounts to the panel behind it.

<u>Decals</u>: The aforementioned tail light decal, front and rear side marker lights, driving lights (although there are chrome driving lights included), 'Trans Am' logos (finally!), and a "FLYAWAY" Missouri plate.

<u>Instructions</u>: Short and to the point, with special instructions to ensure proper assembly of the uni-directional wheel/tire set. No paint references are made, as they do not expect anyone to be doing any painting.

Box Art: Typical Snapfast stuff, with a built-up displayed, and an exploded view on the side of the box.

Why they chose to mold it in Yellow, which I believe, has not been available on a Firebird since the first year, is beyond me. The lack of outside rear view mirrors is also a little disappointing. These things aside, overall, this is a decent little kit which goes together easy enough to allow younger modelers (and even a few older modelers!) to feel a sense of accomplishment when finished.

- More New Stuff! Several rumors are reaching me about new stuff from the "Little Four" such as: a '67 442 W30 (August), '53 Ford Crestline Victoria (November), '64 Bill 'Maverick' Golden S/S Dodge (August), '64 Dodge 330 (With both a slant six and a 383!) (November), a 'Dyno Don' '61 Impala S/S (November), and a '64 Impala lowrider snap kit (w/hopping mechanism) (May '98) from Lindberg. From the gang at Revell-Monogram, a 1/8th scale '32 Ford 'Big Deuce' (limited to 2,500), Paddy Wagon w/figures (limited to 12,500), Elvira T-Bird w/figures (limited to 12,500), a '37 Ford w/cardboard Drive-in", and a '57 Chevy w/cardboard Gas Station (both unlimited). These should all hit the market in the September/October timeframe. Rumors also abound on the possible release of a 1/8th scale Chevy engine kit within a year. And last, but not least, how about a '68 El Camino, '70 Monte Carlo, '58-'59 Chevy pickup, and a '66 GTO from the gang at AMT?! Shaping up to be another banner year, and I haven't even caught up with the current one!!
- Yugos across Russia!! 26-Year-old Aleksei Kuzin from St. Petersburg, Russia is tryin' to set a record. He left on July 29th and is trying to drive 3,000 miles across Russia to Vladivostock using only first gear in his 1985 Yugo! Driving 10 hours a day, at a top speed of 11 miles per hour, he figures he'll complete the trip on August 31st, if his transmission holds up!! Thanks to a local radio station for this gem!
- Theft bait! GTO? Corvette? Porsche? Nope-a beat-up 1979 Monte Carlo!! These are the 1984 Grand Prix (Petty's 200th victory), and the other is the 1970 Superbird. The mail-only car is his '64 Plymouth (first championship car, first Daytona winner). Look for specially-marked containers, or, better yet, sweet-talk your 'significant other' into looking for these containers the next time she makes a 'food run'!
- 'Oldies but Goodies!' Matchbox has resurrected their 'Oldies but Goodies' collection which consists of a 1336 Corvette, 1957 Chevy, 1948 Tucker, 1958 Studebaker Golden Hawk, 1959 Cedilla Coupe de Ville, 1967 Mustang, 1953 Buck Skylark convertible, and 1955 T-Bird. All are 1/43rd scale, and cost only \$19.95 each. You can reach 'em at 1-800-858-0102 weekdays from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M.
- Still more diecasts! This time, it's Classic pickups from the 1950's from Danbury Mint. They include 1957 Dodge Sweptside D100, 1958 Chevy Apache, 1951 Ford F-1, 1956 Ford F-100, 1957 Chevy Cameo Carrier, and a 1953 Chevy 3100. These are in 1/24th scale, and are substantially more

expensive, at \$105 each, but at approximately 150 pieces each, it would seem well worth it! You can get these guys at 47 Richards Avenue Norwalk, CT 06857.

• Rumor mill, the Sequel! Rumors regarding AMT have them abandoning annual kits (Corvettes, Firebirds, Camaros, SUV's, etc.) and concentrating on more new tools of 50'--60's cars; bringing back Craftsman kits w/additions to the original line; reissuing the '39-'40 Ford, and the '41 Plymouth; doing a new tool of a '58 Edsel unclear whether Craftsman or full-glue); the new



'57 Chevy tool is rumored to have three versions-the first will be stock, the second will be Street Machine/Pro Street, and the third will be the same as #2 with the inclusion of photoetch, wire, etc. As far as Revell-Monogram goes, RHCTA rumors indicate the announcement of a '32 Ford pickup, as well as a '32 Ford Woodie-whoooaaa, Nellie!!

- Diecast Muscle! With the explosion in diecasts already out there, Johnny Lightning is going to fan the flames. They will be releasing a 'HOT ROD' series. This series will consist of 1/64th scale copies of cars which actually appeared in HOT ROD magazine! Cars pictured on their Internet site include: Frankenstude, Rumbler (Rambler station wagon), Tom Hammond's '69 Camaro, Mike Lloyd's Pro Street '72 GTO (Awright!), and a sweet '29 Ford crew cab. 
