### **'98 MEETING SCHEDULE**

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (*Greenbelt Road*). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! How about this, gang? To better identify possible kit reviews, at the end of the item on

the kit, the words 'Available' or 'Not Available' will appear. Obviously, a club member may reserve any kit that is available with a simple call to the Editor. Conversely, a kit which is 'Not Available' was either already reserved by someone, or was something new inserted by yours truly, and paid for with my hard-earned moolah! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order):

- 1998 Corvette convertible "Indy 500 Pace Car" SnapFast Plus (AMT/ERTL #30021): Molded in Purple, yellow....As in the past, incredible packaging, with everything individually wrapped....curbside, meaning no engine detail....same excellent Goodyear F-1 uni-directional tires, mounting yellow 5-spoke wheels....painting instructions for final details....clear parking lights/turn signals, clear red tail lights....nice waterslide decals with one drawback-they are numbered as to placement, with no placement guide in the instructions! (Not Available)
- "BigFoot" Ford Monster Truck SnapFast Plus (AMT/ERTL #8268): Molded in Blue.... Simplified construction, with no interior, and blacked-out windows....very nice rubber monster truck tires, with two-piece rims....waterslide decals....this kit includes the decal placement guide. (Available)
- "USA-1" Chevy 4X4 Plus Monster Truck SnapFast Plus (AMT/ERTL #8269, 1/32nd scale): Molded in White....simplified construction, with no interior, and blacked-out windows....very nice rubber monster truck tires, with two-piece rims....waterslide decals....this kit also does have a decal placement guide. (Available)

[Note to all concerned: It has been brought to my attention of late that there is a potential problem with regard to the review articles published in this newsletter. Let me give you a little background on this subject. The model manufacturers (AMT/ERTL, Revell-Monogram, and Lindberg) all attempt to send our club current releases in exchange for our critiques on what we liked and didn't like about them. - Chrome tips! When sending parts out for chrome plating, after cleaning up the parts, it is also a good idea to shoot a few light coats of lacquer on any parts which contain body filler. Thanks to the *Hoosier Model Car Assoc*. newsletter for the tip!
- Hoosiers revisited! According to the Hoosier newsletter, in talks with *Gary Schmidt*, Gary expects the *Galaxy Chebbies* to ship in *late-November* or *early-December*. A regular contributor to the Hoosier newsletter, *Jim Cassassa*, has kind words for our own *Matt Guilfoyle*, who presented him with *samples* of the *artist foil* which Matt demonstrated for the club. *Waytogo*, *Matt*!
- MAMA plates! Another MAMA's boy, *Clyde Bagley*, is attempting to have some *MAMA plates* made up for those interested. Basically, they would be in metal, and very similar to regular license plates, and will be reflective to boot! They will need to have the holes drilled in them, though. - Karmann-Ghia designer dies! Auto Engineer and manufacturer Wilhelm Karmann, designer of the well-known Karmann-Ghia, recently died at age 83 after a lengthy, undisclosed illness. Kudos to <u>The Washington Times</u> for this one!
- "Call me a Wrecker!"... "Okay, you're a Wrecker!" Seems as though Mark David Zenitz, a Frederick resident, was charged on Tuesday with two counts of theft over \$300 after confessing to stealing a '98 Expedition, as well as the tow truck he summoned to the scene of the accident! Apparently, he called Grimm's towing service on Tuesday afternoon, saying he needed to pull the Sport Utility Vehicle out of a ditch. He then drove off in the tow truck! Police caught him near Hagerstown on I-70. Kudos to The Washington Times for this one!
- New diecast Kool! The gang at <u>Hot Wheels</u> have announced a few new sets for 1999. These include the <u>Street Rodder set</u> (includes a '34 Ford convert, and a '47 Ford convert), a <u>Low Rider set</u> (includes a '53 Chevy Bel Air, '69 Buick Riviera, and a '70 Monte Carlo), an <u>El Camino set</u> (includes a '59 and a '70 El Camino), a <u>Smoke 'N Water set</u> (includes a '59 Apache pickup, trailer, and crackerbox raceboat), a <u>Muscle Car Series #1 set</u> (includes a '69 Corvette, and a '69 Olds 442), and a <u>Muscle Cars Series #2 set</u> (includes a '69 AMX, and a '69 GTX). They are making it much harder to hang onto our hard-earned bucks like this! Thanks to the <u>Adkins Collectibles website</u> for the scoop!
- Smart Cats! Jaguar's new 'Cat', the S-Type sedan, which will go on sale next Spring, will be the first car in the US to offer 'Smart' cruise control. It uses Doppler radar to measure speed and distance (Ed. Note: Now, if it could only predict the weather correctly!) of vehicles ahead. The system judges relative position of traffic ahead and adjusts acceleration/braking to maintain a safe distance. If no one is ahead, the car cruises at the set speed. The system, built by GM's Delphi Automotive Systems, will be available only in a few markets, with no price announced. Again, kudos to The Washington Times.
- Smart cars! 'Plug and Play' electronics are about to move from home electronics to cars and trucks! On display at Convergence 1998 (annual 3-day conference showcasing the latest developments in automotive electronics), was a Ford Motor Company vehicle known as the Lifestyle Demonstration Vehicle. This car includes voice-activated controls, onboard laptop computer, printer, satellite navigation system, and E-mail messaging (!). Yeah, my only question is-How much is this sucker gonna cost?! Again, thanks to The Washington Times.
- Horseplay! The Mustang Museum (Hey, Rex!) location list has been narrowed to two-Atlanta and Orlando. Ford Motor Company will donate \$1.5 million dollars to Mustang Museum, Inc., the non-profit group of enthusiasts trying to get it built. It is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$30 million (Ed. Note: That's an expensive neighborhood!). It will be called, "The Mustang Experience-An Interactive Museum", and is expected to include an amphitheater and parade grounds, with more than 100 cars on display. It will also include an IMAX-style theater that will feature a film on the little filly. Again, thanks to The Washington Times.
- "Car of the Century!" Hundreds of leading auto journalists have met and developed a list of the 100 most important and influential cars, and we can all help choose the winner by going to their website (www.cotc.com) and voting! Again, thanks to The Washington Times.
- "I didn't know that!" Arizona law requires a driver to turn on the car lights while moving in a dust storm, but to turn them off when the car is pulled over. Why? Drivers in dust storms tend to follow taillights. A stopped car parked on the shoulder with lighted taillights becomes a target! Thanks to the <u>Prince George's Journal</u> (NOT <u>The Washington Times!</u>) for this one!
- Collectible license plates! Walt Studte said he paid a bargain price of \$10,500 for Delaware license plate tag no. 705. He bought it at a special Estate sale. Because a loophole in Delaware law allows motorists to transfer tag numbers from one vehicle to another, low-digit numbers rarely change hands. Hence, the status (deserved or not) as collector's items. Tag no. 9, for instance, sold for \$185,000 (?!?) in August of 1994. On the same day, tag no. 124 went for \$50,000 and, even as early as 1989, tag no. 79 brought in \$70,000. Mr. Studte is treating the tag as an investment, saying, "I'll put it on a car and wait for the price to go up." Back to The Washington Times for this one gang!

- Good news/Bad news! The good news is, that Revell-Monogram has added a few new kits to their listing for this year! They include: "Pioneer" Avenger funny car, "AC Delco" Monte Carlo (Earnhardt Jr.), and a '99 Corvette convert

- deluxe set. The bad news? Several kits have been delayed. They include: "6 Flags" Firebird (1/99), "Goodwrench" Firebird (2/99), "Summit" Firebird (3/99), "Blue Max" Mustang funny car (3/99), "Mobil" Porsche GT-1 (4/99), "STP" Porsche GT-1 (5/99), '99 Chevy Silverado pickup (6/99), and the Shelby Series 1 (9/99)! Oh well, life goes on!
- Big Three now Big Two! Chrysler stock was to cease trading on the New York Stock Exchange on the afternoon of Thursday, Nov. 12<sup>th</sup> as its merger with Mercedes-Benz became official, thus leaving the 'Motor City' with the General Motors Corp., and the Ford Motor Co. from the original 'Big Three' automakers.


