A Note: This is the Fourth Saturday!

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (*Greenbelt Road*). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. - '69 Musclecars Superset (AMT #30079; includes '69 Hurst Olds, '69 Torino Cobra, & '69 Barracuda): Hurst Olds molded in white....multi-piece big block includes optional finned valve covers and headers....excellent multi-piece chassis....tub-style interior, w/separate dual gate shifter/console....Olds Super Stock mag wheels, 5-spoke mage optional, mounting L60-15's and/or slicks....'69 Barracuda is molded in Lt. Gray, and is a 2 in 1....choice of induction systems (both 4-barrels)....Mopar cast wheels, or Centerlines....tub-style interior....optional Super Stock-style hood scoop....black/white 383 side stripes....'69 Torino Cobra is also molded in Lt. Gray, and a 2 in 1 (stock/NASCAR)....choice of slotted GT rims, or 12-hole slotted wheels....multi-piece big block includes choice of single 4-barrel intake (stock or NASCAR), or 2 x 4-barrel intake....tub-style interior w/full NASCAR roll cage/seat option....6-piece exhaust (stock), 4-piece racing...racing rear spoiler, tail light block-off plates, bumper fairings. Hot off the Press!! Aftermarket News!!

I've just seen a resin aftermarket body for a *chopped-top '48 Ford Woody wagon* that will start your mouth to watering! The body was mastered by *Rik Hoving*, and is to be produced by *Replicas & Miniatures Company of Maryland*.

The 'chop' is a very subtle two scale inches front to rear. The windshield area has been extensively reworked to create a more accurate scale appearance. The windshield has also been moved slightly to the rear and laid back.

The *roof* itself was sectioned approximately one scale inch. It was also shortened to accommodate the laid-back windshield. The roof fabric seams have also been reduced to achieve a more accurate look.

The hood has been trimmed (one scale inch at the front, to zero at the rear) to create a more aggressive stance. The hood peak has been extended onto the cowl and the cowl vent is filled.

The *front wheel opening* has been raised one scale inch, and the splash pan smoothed. The front fender seams have also been filled.

The *rear fenders* have been removed for ease of painting. Along with the fuel filler door being filled, the stone guards have been removed. Additionally, the *rear fenders*, as well as the wooden body, *have been extended* approximately two scale inches behind the wheels to give the car a more aggressive rake.

The wood side trim detail has been corrected to reflect the actual look, which is another subtle correction, which needed to be done.

Included will be sectioned interior wood trim.

The subtle modifications only add to the beauty of the original design. This custom is everything we have come to expect with Rik's work (Norm-where's that #?%&*! custom Lincoln?!). You will all have to get in line, as I've already ordered mine!

Dodge® Concept Car Snapfast Plus

[AMT/ERTL # 8129; 1/25th scale; 35 pieces (despite the 32 shown on the box); metallic copper-orange, midnight blue, black, clear, transparent red, vinyl tires]

Don't let that title fool you, this is the *Dodge Copperhead*. It's just that the car curiously isn't referred to by its name on the box or in the instructions. Fortunately, the *decal sheet does include* the *Copperhead script* for the rear end.

Oft compared to its it's older stable mate roadster, *Dodge Viper*, Copperhead is more aptly viewed in light of such modern sports cars as BMW's Z3 or Porsche's Boxster. Copperhead was designed strictly with the sports car enthusiast in mind. Although there are no plans to put the Copperhead into production, John Herlitz, Chrysler's Vice President of Product Design says it would fit comfortably into any sports car enthusiast's budget. Chrysler's Design Director, K. Neil Walling says that it's the sports car for those "...who like lithe, aerodynamic treatments combined with a low center of gravity." Indeed, the car's ground clearance is a scant 5 inches.

Introduced in 1997as a follow-up to the Viper roadster, Copperhead is a smart amalgam of existing assemblies and new engineering. This approach is reminiscent of the way *Pontiac developed their Fiero* so many years ago. From the existing inventory of assemblies, Dodge selected the short-and-long arm (SLA) Coil Over Shock front suspension of the Chrysler LH, the SLA Coil Over Shock rear suspension of the Eagle Talon, and the heavy-duty, close-ratio five-speed manual transmission of the Dodge Dakota.

All-new is a sleek, steel body wrapped around Chrysler's aluminum new generation, high-output, 2.7 liter, four cam V-6 engine. The V6's impressive 220 horsepower output is ultimately delivered to a massive set of cast aluminum 20 x 9 inch rear wheels encased in a unique set of Goodyear P255/40 R 20 tires. The tires are unique in that they feature an asymmetric snake scale tread pattern. The front wheels measure up at only 18 x 8 inches with a matching set of squamous tires in a slightly smaller P225/40 R 18 size. Even though the engine compartment currently houses a V-6, Dodge wisely left enough room for a V-8 to snuggle down in there later on.


AMT/ERTL has really done an outstanding job rendering Copperhead in plastic. The proportions are dead-on and the details are right. *The only down-side to this model is that it is a curbside kit*, meaning there is no scale representation of its *venomous V-6*, save for the oil pan and starter images molded into the chassis.

The one-off cast aluminum wheels found supporting the farthest corners of Copperhead have been accurately replicated with a minor exception - the finish applied to the wheels is just too dark. Though flawless in its application, you'll want to cover them in a brighter metalizer finish for realism. The asymmetrical snake-scale tread of the tires is well represented, but the sidewall markings are not. The scale tires feature oversized, raised lettering rather than the small, debossed markings needed for accuracy. Still, the very modern wheel and tire package from this kit should show up on some contemporary street rod projects in the near future.

Eleven pieces are provided to build an almost-perfect replica of Copperhead's *interior*. The only detail preventing perfection is the absence of vent details on the door panels. The recesses for the vents are positioned high on the panels and the absence of the vents themselves is rather conspicuous. The *interior is molded in a dark blue plastic* that closely matches the *Deep Amethyst hue* of Copperhead's snake skin-textured leather interior. The dash, console, and door panels appear quite correct. If the seats have any flaw it is that the bottoms appear flat in comparison to Copperhead's billowy seats. Because AMT/ERTL did not provide any painting guidance, you'll have to reference the backside of the box to see where to paint the *Vermillion Red interior accents*. Pay close attention to the area on the back wall of the interior, right between the seats. This area should also be Vermillion Red, but there is no marking on the part to indicate the size of the insert. The painted example on the box will guide you correctly. Also note on the console that the bezel surrounding the door lock and window controls should be painted aluminum, not left blue as the sample on the box indicates.

The *chassis* is technically a simple plate to which the wheels attach, but it seems a shame to say that. The engraving and detail on the chassis plate are quite impressive. Molded in black, it makes good use of texture to bring out highlights and hide lowlights. A set of *four disc brake rotors and calipers* attach firmly to the chassis before the metal axle are slipped into place and capped off with the wheels.

instructions call for. This will make pressing them in easier and will allow you to apply some glue to the backside of the pins to ensure that the lenses will stay in place. The same holds true for the outside rear-view mirrors. If you choose to open the hood and rear deck lids, keep in mind that the hood opens from back to front and the rear deck opens from front to back. The only omission from the body is a minor one: the mounts on the rear deck for the soft-top are missing.

All four gauges and the tachometer; body scripts and emblems; and back-up light lenses are provided as well-registered, water-slide decals. The decal sheet even includes a very nice Dodge factory license plate. Rear-view mirror faces and headlight reflectors are provided as good-looking, die-cut Mylar stickers.

There are some general missing items of note, some good, some not so good. On the list of good missing items we have sprue attachment points. The kit designers went out of their way to hide them. For example, the wheels are attached in an area that is well hidden beneath the tires on the finished model rather than right on the edge of the outer face as is customary. On the not so good list of missing items we find several helpful bits of information missing from the instructions. The parts are not numbered and the instructions do not call out differences in left and right parts such as the seats, headlights, and taillights. Also missing is any descriptive text about Dodge's Copper-Fire-Orange concept car. Also, no painting guidance is provided, so you'll have to do some research to get your interior details colored correctly. Start by looking at the backside of the box.

This kit assembles with minimal effort and provides a very nice-looking replica straight out of the box. Its few foibles are minor, destined to go unnoticed by many. With nothing more than a slight lowering, detail painting in the interior, a brighter finish on the wheels, and a lighter color on the body, this can be an outstanding curbside replica of Dodge's Copperhead. As for detailing this kit, the sky's the limit. It looks as though opening the hood and trunk should be relatively easy efforts. Hinging the doors would take considerably more effort. Finding chassis components would be downright tough, though several components from AMT/ERTL's Plymouth Prowler glue kit may be readily adaptable such as the V-6 engine.

'62 Buick Electra 225 Pro Shop

[AMT/ERTL #6116; 1/25th scale; 100+ pieces; Grey. Chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires]

This is a straight reissue of the original kit, including some really odd customizing parts.

Engine: This very basic assembly consists of eight pieces. There is no separate carburetor. The exhaust manifolds are molded to the block. The kit contains only one building option.

Chassis: It don't get any simpler than this, folks! The wheels mount on steel rods that are run through the chassis. All 'detail' is molded to the chassis. The chassis mounts to the body using four metal screws (Better stop now-I'm getting nostalgic!).

Wheels and tires: My main complaint in this area, as I was not expecting much, is that the tires do not have white sidewalls as shown on the box art. I consider this a very bad misrepresentation by AMT. You'll have to raid your parts box or see one of the aftermarket suppliers for whitewalls. There are stock and 'custom' wheel covers provided.

Body: The body appears to be crisply molded in gray plastic. This mold has obviously over-utilized over the last 37 years. There are some 'period' (read: Ugly!) customizing parts included.

Interior: Tub-style interior with molded-in bucket seats. Also included are a center console, and period accessories.

Glass: One-piece front and rear glass. Clear red taillights (Be careful, they are tiny!).

Chrome: The chrome plating on the grille and front bumper, while shiny, shows that the mold appears to have sustained some damage over the years. I have seen similar "lumps" on other examples. This is where I have some serious issues with AMT. It seems that any kit produced in the last few years has 'bad' chrome, either because of failure to protect the tree by bagging it separately, or poor part preparation and finish. I hope that the new owners pay more attention to Quality Control.

Decals: There are somewhat understated black and magenta accent stripes, and 1962 California "HARDTOP", in addition to Arizona license plates, and a tachometer face.

Because of the high cost for an original (either built or unbuilt) kit, I do recommend this kit, in spite of the problems. I would hope that in the future, attention to preparing to molds before issuing (or reissuing) a kit.

- "On the Prowl!" For '99, Daimler-Chrysler will introduce a new color for their hot rod Prowler-red! This will be in addition to purple, as well as bright yellow, and black, introduced last year. - Land Yacht SUV! A new SUV (Sport Utility Vehicle) from Ford Motor Company named, appropriately enough, the Excursion, holds the distinction of being the biggest of them all! It is reportedly 19 feet long (1 foot longer than a Suburban!!), weighs in at 3 and ½ tons, stands a bit over 76" tall, and is reported to get 12 mpg (downhill, with a stiff tail wind, no doubt!). Ford hopes to sell 50,000 to 60,000 of these behemoths at a cost of \$45,000 to \$50,000 per copy. The Sierra Club summed it up best with their suggested ad campaign-"The Ford Valdez. The woman had just been involved in a minor accident about 8:30 a.m. when she got out of her car, and then her clothing! - Smart tires?! US Engineers have designed a new 'smart tire' that will tell drivers when it is going flat or needs to be replaced. Developed by researchers from Case Western Reserve University in Ohio and Goodyear Tire & Rubber company, it uses tiny temperature and pressure sensors with microscopic components. Each tire also contains an ID chip that helps tire makers keep track of their stock. To identify a tire, or read its temperature or pressure, a radio signal is sent out by a transmitter built into a vehicle, or a handheld scanner. No word on when it'll be available, or at what cost.
