A Note: This is the Fourth Saturday!

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! How about this, gang? To better identify possible kit reviews, at the end of the item on the kit, the words 'Available' or 'Not Available' will appear. Obviously, a club member may reserve any kit that is available with a simple call to the Editor. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order):

Dick Landy's '68 Dodge Charger (Revell-Monogram #2573): Molded in white.... rehash of '69 R/T....nice 22-piece Hemi powerplant (w/headers), w/optional 3-piece engine stand.... roll bar w/fire extinguisher, racing shifter, and hood scoop included....front suspension consists of 8 pieces (w/steerable front wheels), rear consists of 11 pieces....decals include all red and blue striping, white R'/T stripe for rear fender/trunk area, and several smaller contingency decals (Ed. Note: See review this issue!) (Not Available)

[Note to all concerned: It has been brought to my attention of late that there is a potential problem with regard to the review articles published in this newsletter. The model manufacturers (AMT/ERTL, Revell-Monogram, and Lindberg) all attempt to send our club current releases in exchange for our critiques on what we liked and didn't like about them. <u>Street Fury</u>
[AMT/ERTL #30007; 1/25th scale; 22 pieces; new tool]

When I first learned of the "Snapfast Slammers" line of kits from AMT/ERTL, I remember saying to myself, "Self, more plastic for the lads." Well, they got me with this one. It looked so good on the box, that I was unable to resist it.

When I opened the box, I was impressed. The body proportions are dead on. The red plastic is so shiny that painting is totally unnecessary, unless you do not like red, or you are planning modifications to the car.

Other than removing the parts from the tree, no tools or cement are necessary, as this model is of the press fit assembly variety.

Once assembled, it looks pretty good, with it's 20" Tri-spoke wheels, tube grille, blower peekin' out through the hood, accenting its' slammed stance.

I can't help but wonder what this one will look like as a 50's 'Croozer' i.e., whitewall tires, wheel covers, flat hood, and chrome bumpers? That's what I think I am going to do to this one!

If you want a change of pace, try one of these. You will be in for a pleasant surprise!

<u>Dick Landy's '68 Dodge Charger</u> [Revell #2573; 1/25th scale; 118 pieces; modified reissue]

When Revell-Monogram released the '69 Dodge Charger R/T as a 2 in 1 Pro Modeler kit in late '97, there were rumors that this kit would be the basis for different variants of the car. When we first received the kit, we noticed that the kit was conceptually sound, the roof on the otherwise beautiful body was too low, giving the car a chopped top look. The manufacturer (to their credit) did make the necessary changes to the tool, and provided replacement parts for any modeler who requested them.

As nice as that kit was, it was a bit pricey as compared to similar kits on the market. The manufacturer justified the additional expense with the inclusion of additional parts included for a second version of the kit (i.e., drag racing parts).

The manufacturer then brought out a single version of the '69 Charger R/T which included parts to build a replica stock version only, which reduced the kit price to more 'normal' levels, due to the reduced parts content.

Earlier this year, we received the '69 Dodge Charger Daytona ProModeler 2 in 1 kit, which provided us with yet another version of this basic kit. This kit gave us a bonus of photoetched pieces, along with enough parts for two versions of the car. A replica stock version, and a car that could best be described as a 'Street Legal' NASCAR stocker, in that it was dressed up with nowhere to race. At least you did get the basis for an accurate NASCAR racer of that vintage, if you could indulge in a bit of kitbashing and aftermarket parts substitution. Now, we have a fourth version of this kit.

In my past reviews of the assorted versions of this kit, I have stated my approval of these kits, and this one is no exception. Revell has made a few significant changes to this kit to create some excitement.

First of all, this version of the car represents one of the most popular versions of the car, that of a drag racer. But not just any drag racer, but one of the most famous Dodge racers in history, none other than cigar-chompin' 'Dandy' Dick Landv.

This replica is beautiful. The decals are right on the mark, according to my reference material, with proper color registration, in red and metallic blue. One must exercise caution in applying these decals, as they will cover almost the entire car. Follow the instructions carefully when you apply them, as they are very delicate.

As we examine the kit, it goes together the same way as the others in this series of well-detailed replicas. There are differences in this kit other than the decals, and they are as follows:

- > Body: The vinyl roof texture has been removed (Thank you!), but the side marker lights have not been revised from the '69 tool to properly represent the correct '68 units. In their defense, the manufacturer does instruct the modeler to fill the side marker lights in, and use the decal replacements. They should have filled in the '69 side marker lights for the modeler. The grille and tail light panel are unique to the '68, and are very well represented
- > Interior: The unique seat stitch style of the '68 Charger is present. Not shown in the instructions, but included is a center console and stock shifter.
- > Wheels & Tires: Wrong! Wrong! Dick Landy's cars ran Cragar S/S mags! Not the Keystone Classics furnished in the kit. A better choice of front tires could also have been provided, as those furnished in the kit are too wide for a real drag racer.

Other than the wheels and front tires, this kit should build into a fantastic replica of Dick Landy's '68 Charger. With a bit of judicial kitbashing with the ProModeler '69 R/T, other possibilities include the following:

- Dick Landy's '69 Charger
- > '69 Charger sans vinyl roof
- > Replica Stock '68 Charger with or without a vinyl roof

Hmmmm, that black '68 Charger from the all-time best movie car chase film of all time ("Bullitt", of course!), or the "Vanishing Point" Charger (TV remake) are also possibilities (Ed. Note: How 'bout the Charger in "Dirty Mary, Crazy Larry"?). Get this one! They are goin' like hotcakes!!

It features rear-facing emergency lights, spotlight, removable chains, operable front bumper-mounted winch, movable towing booms, removable real rubber spare tire, and an opening toolbox containing three flares. It goes for \$135 (five installments of \$27, plus \$1.60 S + H per installment). Or, how about a 1940 Ford Coca-Cola Salesman's car? It features opening doors (to view a folded suit jacket and briefcase), hood (to see the Ford Flathead V-8), and trunk (where two cases of removable Cokes are stored) (Hey, Boothe, this one's right up yer alley!). This one retails for only \$119 (four installments of only \$29.75, plus \$1.95 S + H per installment).
