<u>From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695):</u> Take Exit 7, Route 295 (*Baltimore-Washington Parkway*) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (*Greenbelt Road*), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (*Greenbelt Road*). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

□ '99 Ford SVT Lightning (Revell #85-7665): Molded in White....no chrome in this one whatsoever!....20+ piece Triton 5.4 liter supercharged V-8....Goodyear Eagle F1 tires, which mount unplated two-piece 5-spoke mag wheels....tub-style interior, with drop-in door panels....six-piece ground effects package....disc brakes at all four corners....one-piece front end includes both grille and front bumper....decals include white-faced gauges, SVT wheel center cap decals, 'SVT' emblems, assorted underhood decals, and two sets of license plates-'ZBN 697' MN, and '13A9387' SD (Not Available).

[Note to all concerned: It has been brought to my attention of late that there is a potential problem with regard to the review articles published in this newsletter. Let me give you a little background on this subject. The model manufacturers (AMT/ERTL, Revell-Monogram, and Lindberg) all attempt to send our club current releases in exchange for our critiques on what we liked and didn't like about them. That means that we need to get written reviews published in the newsletter in a reasonable time frame to accomplish this. If you will recall, I have stood up at recent club meetings to enlist the aid of the members in attendance to get kit reviews. At present, Ron Hamilton has done more than his fair share of reviews. 1999 Ford SVT Lightning pickup

[Revell #7665; 100+ pieces; White, clear, and clear red (that's it!)]

Well gang, here is the latest player in the kick-butt hot rod pickup segment, the *Ford Lightning*. The formula for success for this segment started out simply enough-to one pickup truck, add liberal doses of horsepower, a nice set of wheels, and maybe a few graphics. Stir well, and voila! *The 'Little Red Express' Dodge pickup (circa 1978)*, and *Chevy 454SS (circa 1990)* were born (with the *GMC Syclone immediately following it, figuratively speaking, of course!)*. Not to be left out, in 1993, Ford quickly entered the fray with their *F-150 Lightning pickup*, which was cooked up by the gang within the Ford Skunkworks (a.k.a. SVO at the time, which is now SVT). With the appearance of the Ford Lightning into the fray,

the gang over at the Blue Oval raised the bar somewhat, in that the Lightning also included a wheel and tire upgrade and a few suspension tweaks, which enabled it to 'handle' the Chevy, ensuring its victory over the 454SS in braking and skidpad tests, allowing the Chevy to marginally outrun it (the Lightning's top speed was electronically governed).

Sadly, it seemed as though the big Chevy disappeared from the scene, while the Lightning remained. Sales numbers were never a big problem, as production of the current version will most likely not exceed 4,000 this year. And for 1999, the guys at Ford seem intent on 'improving' the truck with an *Eaton roots-type supercharger* bolted to the 5.4-liter Triton V-8, and the addition of 18" wheels and a set of 5-spoke mag wheels. The supercharger cranks out 8 psi of boost, good for 360 horsepower and 0-60 times of 5.8 seconds (as recorded by Car & Driver magazine, January 1999)! We're talking musclecar territory here, folks! The gang at Revell has kitted this truck. So, let's quit jawing and take a look!

Engine: The Triton 5.4-liter V-8 features a longitudinal seam, which will be covered by the oil and transmission pans. A set of nice, finned valve covers and the roots-type blower top off the engine. A separate oil filter, and power steering pump, A/C pump and alternator are also included.

<u>Chassis:</u> The chassis includes a simplified lower front suspension, and a sway bar. Front springs are molded in two pieces each, and tubular upper A-arms, and disc brakes round out the front suspension. Also included is a steering box. The exhaust system properly exits at the side of the truck, just in front of the rear tire. Two crossmembers and a two-piece gas tank are also added to this unit. The rear suspension includes separate third member, leaf springs, rear end cover, rear spring hangers, disc brakes, and shocks. A three-piece radiator and upper hose along with the driveshaft are also included. Sadly, a *plastic spare tire* rounds out the chassis.

<u>Wheels/Tires:</u> It appears as though the gang at Revell have included the new *Goodyear F1 wheels* from their excellent C5 Corvette kit. While this isn't all bad, I believe that the *Corvette* runs along *on 17" rims*, vs. 18" for the Ford. They have tooled up a positively gorgeous set of 5-spoke mag wheels with inners, again similar in execution to the aforementioned Corvette. It won't be long before this set of wheels shows up on a street rod (and for that matter, maybe even that Eaton-supercharged V-8 as well! That would be an awesum street rod!!).

<u>Body:</u> The pickup cab consists of two main pieces (main cab, and the rear cab wall), to which are added the integral front bumper/grille, hood, outside mirrors, and ground effects. The windshield wipers are separate items, as is the rear cab light. The pickup one-piece bed includes a separate two-piece tail gate, rear step bumper, two clear red tail lights, three chassis crossmembers, and the remainder of the ground effects package (two pieces per side).

<u>Interior</u>: A tub-style interior, to which separate door panels are added. The dash is the same two-piece affair as in earlier versions of this truck, in that the instrument cluster is a separate piece, and a clear lens is included to cover the gauge cluster. The proper white-faced gauge decals finish off the dash. The stubby steering column features tilt/gear selector/turn signal stalks. The bench seat is two pieces.

Glass: Front and rear windows (sliding rear) are included, as well as the aforementioned gauge face cover, and fog light lenses.

<u>Decals</u>: Decals include SVT wheel center logos, assorted underhood markings, white-faced SVT gauge cluster, and two sets of license plates (*no vanity plates*).

<u>Chrome:</u> There ain't none! Revell has included not one whit of chrome in this kit!! Everything will be painted. Thank yew!!

My hat is off to the gang at Revell for kitting a truck that will see no more than 4,000 full-size copies in production. How long do you think the gang at *Chevy* will go before resurrecting the *SS* in some shape or form? Not long, I bet! And do you think a *Dodge Ram R/T* (we could only hope that it would be heavily based on their *VTS* concept pickup truck!!) is very far down the road as well?! It's gonna be interesting!

Karmann Ghia returns?! VW says its new Beetle convertible is being developed by Wilhelm Karmann GmbH in northern Germany! The deal was recently announced at the 50th Anniversary celebration of the long cooperation between Karmann and Europe's largest automaker. Karmann is also developing a new version of the Golf model convertible, both companies reported. Karmann has built approximately 2.6 million cars for VW over the years, primarily convertibles.
Mustang Crossbreed! According to a recent article in the Wheels section of the Prince George's Journal, the Mustang will receive its first all-new platform in 2003. This platform is currently used for the 2000 Lincolns and Jaguar S-Type sedan. The article also goes on to state that the new 'Stang will still feature a V-6 and a V-8, and that a 350hp Cobra V-8 (possibly hooked to a 6-speed tranny!) may be offered! The above info was posted on a website (www.blueovalnews.com), which Ford recently sued to strip it of its internal reports. No comments from Ford on the veracity of this info!
New Trucks?! General Motors recently unveiled what they refer to as "Big Kids Toys". The first one was an 'Acid Yellow' Chevy S10 4-door pickup (what'd they do, leave a yellow truck parked out in the 'acid rain' for a while?!). After it was unveiled, they announced it would indeed build a crew-cab S10 next year! It will feature four forward-opening doors; it will be built on the long-wheelbase chassis, and will feature a 4.3 liter V-6. Their next truck, the Sierra extended cab Professional 4X4, is more suited to contractors and builders. It featured a winch, trailer hitch, stainless steel running boards, self-storing loading ramp, remote-controlled halogen work light, electronically extendable heated side mirrors, and a tool chest. Inside, a laptop with a wireless keyboard, linked to a bubblejet printer (in the center console), hands-free cell phone, and an Internet link, a briefcase holder fitted to the rear door, a removable case stored under the seat for blueprint storage, and a swing-out compartment for emergency/first aid gear. Finally, the truck has a battery-charging station, with three 18-volt batteries, and a generator that supplies 5,000 volts of power to 110- and 220-volt outlets!! Argh! Argh! More Power! No word on production possibility of this puppy. On a related note, at a recent SEMA show, Daimler-Chrysler showed off a 'GT Cruiser' based on the soon-to-be-released PT Cruiser (Gag me!), and a 250-horse Plymouth 'Howler' (a hotted-up version of the Prowler).
